OLD BUSINESS

Gallons processed vs gallons billed study/Flow monitoring – The data showed that during the rain event the curve of the data was extreme and both meters were the same. It indicates that there are connections to the system which includes gutter drains and sump pumps. A program to do a smoke test is required to find illegal hook ups.
