As summertime begins, we need to be more diligent in our observations. One of the best deterrents is acknowledgement. When you see someone walking by, acknowledge them with a hello or a nod. This lets the person know you have seen them and are aware of them. Typically, if it is someone thinking of checking cars to see if they are locked or looking at your neighbor's house thinking it is unoccupied, they will move on because they see neighbors are observant. At the same time, if you feel a person is not where they should not be, appears dangerous, or has you feeling uncomfortable, do not speak to them or approach them, do not go over to your neighbor's house because you see someone lurking around the side of the building, CALL 911 immediately. Do not hesitate.
