Attendance: All Budget Committee Members present

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Joint Meeting with North Hampton Select Board

Chair Stanton introduced Chair Maggiore. Mr. Maggiore opened his meeting to introduce a new warrant article that would place the Governor Dale property into conservation. \$150.0K would need to be raised through taxation and \$350.0K would be provided by the Conservation Commission Reserve Fund. Mr. Maggiore adjourned the Select Board meeting.

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Recess

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- Review of FY13-14 North Hampton Town Budget with Town
- 33 Administrator and Department Chiefs/Managers
- Merit Pool: Mr. Caron reiterated that he would construct a formalized Merit Pool process.

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Highway Department Budget: Corrected expenditures from FY2011.

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Police Department Holiday Pay: Expense has been reclassified to its own account.

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- <u>Highway Department Overtime</u>: A discussion of what overtime is
- controllable/uncontrollable. Messrs. Peck and Caron agreed Winter Maintenance is 42 not controllable but that Construction and Spring Clean-up could be.

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Telephone Expenses: Mr. Peck calculated FY12 expenses were \$31.4K and the 12 45 month run rate was \$29.7. The proposed budget is \$34.9K up 17%. 46 detailed Heating Oil has a total proposed budget of \$37.5K up 63% over actual 47 expended. Electricity accounts had a proposed \$29.1K with a 12 month rolling

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expended of \$21.1K. Mr. Caron said he would look into all of these accounts.

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<u>Solid Waste</u>: FY14 proposed budget should be \$97.3K, \$73.34 per ton.

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- Recycling Electricity Cost: \$1.0K could be deleted from this budget as the bill was 53
- being paid out of the General Government electricity line. It was also noted that 54
- with the third party provider, we should have decreasing electricity costs. Messrs. 55
- Caron and McCormick said they would go over all of the billing. Mr. Stanton 56
- 57 thought that all of the electricity lines should add up to a proposed budget closer
- to \$23.0K. 58

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Highway Department On-Call: \$1.0K per year is part of the Town's CBA.

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Warrant Articles

- Mr. Caron stated there were no other monetary changes to the warrants. There is 63 a language adjustment to warrants dealing with the Ambulance Fee Revolving 64
- Fund. 65

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Messrs. Golden and Hamilton asked for clarification of terminology in the warrants 67 for better understanding for the voters. Mr. Caron agreed. 68

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70 Mr. Hubbard discussed the Highway Department paving warrant.

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- Discussion of the Library warrant article to raise \$100.0K and whether they might 72
- be in danger of raising zero funds with the new Conservation warrant on the table. 73
- The discussion also involved whether the Budget Committee could suggest a 74
- different amount on a warrant to the Select Board. Mr. Peck felt that the Budget 75
- Committee could not make any request but could vote yes or no on a warrant. 76

Mr. Miller stated the Select Board might be in favor of a reconsideration of the

78 Library warrant.

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- 80 Mr. Walzak moved to decrease the Library warrant to \$50.0K, second by Mr.
- 81 Garnett. Discussion.

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Mr. Golden revised the motion to decrease the Library warrant to zero, Mr. Miller second. Discussion.

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- Mr. Golden revised his motion to a dollar range of \$0-50.0K.
- 87 Discussion.

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Mr. Golden revised his motion back to the original motion to have the Library warrant article raise \$50.0K. Discussion.

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92 Motion passed 8-0-1

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Dearborn Park warrant article discussion took place. Mr. Hubbard felt the project could be moved to next year without a great increase in cost and moving it gave his department time to rebuild the road leading into the park.

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98 Ms. Kilroy made a motion to defer the Dearborn Park warrant into the next fiscal 99 year. Mr. Walzak, second. Motion passed 8-0-1.

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A discussion of what is the Budget Committee Role in reviewing budgets was led by Messrs. Peck and Miller.

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Mr. Stanton asked for an informal poll from the Committee to see if anyone would cut the Town Budget by more than \$25.0K. Mrs. Allen calculated a decrease of \$25.0-30.0K. Mr. Garnett felt nothing more should be cut. Mr. Walzak stated that multi-year contracts with automatic increases were the real culprits to budgetary inflation. He also stated that future negotiations and the number of people hired needs to be thought through carefully.

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111 Messrs. Hamilton and Peck suggested a working session with the Select Board one 112 year before a contract expires.

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Mr. Golden asked what has the town and the school done to increase productivity in the last five years. Ms. Kilroy stated that good expenditures get missed in a

- scrubbed down budget. Mr. Garnett said that there has been too much deferred maintenance over the years and now we have to get it done.

 Mr. Stanton summarized that townspeople are focused on their tax rate. He felt the percent increase was not unreasonable given the passage of the CBA's and the NHRetirement System pushdown.
