

# NORTH HAMPTON CONSERVATION COMMISSION

November 8, 2005

## 1) ROLL CALL

Present when the meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. was Chris Ganotis and Chuck Gordon, Co-Chairmen, Lee Brooks, Patty O'Connor and John Peterson.

## 2) CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES - October 11, 2005

**After a motion, duly seconded**, it was voted to approve the minutes as presented.

## 3) TREASURER'S REPORT – through October 31, 2005 Renewal of Matured CD

Chris reviewed the report and confirmed that \$82,571.25 of the Capital Reserve Funds No. 8 was rolled over into a twelve month CD (having just expired from the initial six month term). According to the report, the total funds for all accounts is \$386,294.72.

Discussion ensued regarding the \$5,000 deposit into the Little River Salt Marsh account. Chuck confirmed that this represents a State reimbursement for funds spent by the Conservation Commission for rip rap and culvert work at the marsh.

**After a motion, duly seconded**, it was voted to approve reports for August, September and October as presented.

## 4) OLD BUSINESS

Postponement of mowing—D'Urso Conservation Land

This has not been done yet due to the amount of rain.

## 5) NEW BUSINESS

Planning Board Application Review - Lafayette Crossing

Commission members reviewed the application for a T.G.I. Friday's restaurant at the North Hampton Outlet Mall. **After a motion, duly seconded**, it was voted to relay to the Planning Board that the Conservation Commission sees no conservation issues.
