

North Hampton Heritage Commission Minutes

December 21, 2006

Meeting was called to order at 9:38am in the Heritage Commission Conference Room .

Homer Johnson, as a welcomed guest, gave a presentation on the project that the Recreation Department and supportive citizens are proposing for a warrant issue: to purchase the "Dalton Homestead" (now Mulcahy) at 3 Exeter Road. Homer invited members of the Commission and representatives from the North Hampton Historical Society to arrange for a tour of the home, in an effort to gain support in the community. The proposed parcel abuts Dearborn Park, which is in dire need to expand. The house, if purchased by the town, would either be subdivided and sold to offset the costs of the endeavor, or would be used by the town for recreation and possibly the Heritage Commission and Historical Society as a museum.

Jenny reported that the town reimbursed her for the printing expense of the "Some of North Hampton's Famous People" brochure and that the brochure and extended histories were being placed on the town website Heritage page.

Minutes were read and approved for August 19 (motion by Carolyn Brooks; seconded by Jane Currivan), September 19 (motion by Jane Palmer; seconded by Jane Currivan), November 2 (Motion by Jane Currivan; seconded by Carolyn Brooks.) These minutes will be placed on the website.

No report on the Town Hall Committee. Next brochures planned to be of more famous people, interesting and old homes (and families of the homesteads) not covered by the walking tour brochure (as the "Sears house").
