North Hampton Heritage Commission Meeting November 15, 2007 Heritage Conference Room (Old) Town Office

A. Memberships

A bi-monthly magazine is published by National Trust of Historic Preservation, which the Heritage Commission which receive due to its membership to that organization. The ¹/₄" glass top to cover the Heritage Conference Room table was delivered by Glass Pro, 2875 Lafayette, Portsmouth (436-2882) and billed as quoted for \$198.

D. North Hampton Historic Farms

Chris Ganotis of the Conservation Commission for the Town of North Hampton contacted Jenifer Landman to request that members of the Heritage Commission participate as a resource to a group of Winnacunnet High School students, desiring to prepare a brochure on the historic farms of North Hampton as a school project. Jane Palmer and Carolyn Brooks volunteered to be available for contact by the students.

E. Bridge Market Brochure

There are four bridges named for the four servicemen killed in WWII:

- (1) Meyers
- (2) Small

- (3) Brown
- (4) Hobbs

The project objective is to prepare a brochure by the next election with photographs of the plaques, a brief bio of the person, where the individual died, and if possible a picture of the honoree. Resources for the information might include the library, Beverly Fornette, and the American Legion.

Action:

- (1) Jane Palmer to locate the newspaper coverage of the dedication ceremony.
- (2) Jane Palmer to contact John Hollman about the plaques.
- (3) Jane Currivan to complete photographs, including the Old Town Office plaque.

Jane Currivan identified damage to one of the bridges on Walnut Avenue—yellow paint was on the guard rail.

F. Approval of Minutes

The minutes of the prior meeting were presented for approval. Carolyn Brooks made the motion to approve; Jane Currivan seconded the motion; and the vote was unanimous.

I. <u>Headstone Brochures</u>

Chief Page expressed concern that a brochure about the historic headstones in local cemeteries might encourage vandalism. This topic will be discussed at a future meeting.

J. Other Business

The digital camera and case will be labeled as town property.

Future projects might include identification and a publication of notable areas of town, such as Page Town and Little River districts.
