- A) Aquarion has been asked to explain whether, during a power outage--and particularly during a prolonged power outage as the Seacoast communities experienced in 2009 -- that the portable generators that they claim will supply some portion of the water flows and water pressure are adequate to do so. The North Hampton Water Commission proposed a capital equipment improvement for permanent, onsite generators that would improve public safety in the instance of such power outages. Fire Chief Cote has stated that it took several days to procure the necessary portable generators in 2009.
- B) North Hampton requested that Aquarion color-code the fire hydrants to reflect the fire flows that hydrant testing indicates each hydrant can be expected to yield. To date, Aquarion has stated that it has no plans to color-code its hydrants. It indicated it would review this request. Hampton's Fire Chief has also requested color-coded hydrants.
