APPROVAL OF MINUTES – JANUARY 26, 2017 MEETING

Mr. Spataro moved the committee vote to approve the meeting minutes of the January 26, 2017 meeting as submitted. Mr. Smith seconded the motion. Mr. Leland abstained as he was not present at the meeting. Minutes approved as submitted.

SCHOOL DEPARTMENT FY2018 CAPITAL REQUESTS

Ms. Levesque presented the K-8 School Districts' capital request for roof repairs to the Proctor School. During FY2016 the first phase of the Proctor School roof repair project included the repair and restoration of 38,000 square feet of flat roof. The work included the application of a urethane water-proofing membrane designed to restore and increase the lifespan of the roof for a minimum of ten years.

Ms. Levesque informed the Committee that this FY2018 capital request represents the second phase of the roof project and involves replacement of the 13,000 square feet of shingled pitched roof with a metal roofing system carrying a warranty of 30 years and a projected life span of 50 years. An updated roof study (included in the meeting packet materials) was conducted in 2016 which estimates the pitched roof replacement at \$300,000. The project would be funded using one-time revenues (free cash) with no debt or additional tax impact.

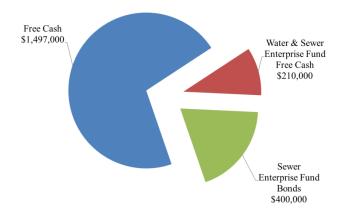
Ms. Levesque reviewed the projects in the CIP out-years indicating that the Peaslee School project which entails the replacement of classroom asbestos floor tiles will depend on whether or not the Mass School Building Authority will approve a cost-sharing grant for the comprehensive renovation/addition of the school in the coming years.

She also noted that several future paving projects are under review with assistance from the DPW Department.

REVIEW OF DRAFT FY2018 CAPITAL BUDGET AND FY2018-FY2023 CIP

Mr. Coderre reviewed the FY2018-FY2023 draft Capital Improvement Program (CIP). The proposed FY2018 Capital Budget totals \$2,107,000, of which \$1,497,000 is anticipated to be funded with Free Cash (one-time revenues), resulting in no additional tax impact. In addition, \$210,000 in funding will come from the Water & Sewer Enterprise Fund balance with no additional impact on rate payers. The only anticipated debt will be \$400,000 for the West Main Pump Station rehabilitation, which will be paid for out of user fees. The table below shows the proposed FY2018 projects by department.
