Mrs. Rutan called the meeting to order at 7:05

John Coderre, Town Administrator, introduced everyone present including Katie Crockett Michael Pagano, and Peter Caruso of Lamoreaux-Pagano; Mel Overmeyer and Alan Minkus of Strategic Building Solutions; and June Hubbard Ward, Northborough Finance Director. He then provided a brief overview of the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) process and the work of the Lincoln Street Elementary School Building Committee to date.

Alan Minkus presented further information about the MSBA process and the various modules necessary to fulfill in order to be eligible for MSBA grant funds. He stressed the key dates for submission of materials to MSBA.

Peter Caruso presented the first part of the PowerPoint highlighting the amount of space allocated for the school, the present state of the building, and the excellent maintenance record of the building. He noted that all of the building systems have surpassed their useful life.

Katie Crockett continued with the PowerPoint presentation. She described the seven acre site and gave details about the need for the school to be in session while construction is happening. She also explained the Conservation Commission guidelines connected with the construction. She continued with the details of two new construction options. She explained that the Building Committee ruled these options out because of the site problems.

Three options for addition/renovation were presented. John Coderre offered the rationale for the Building Committee's decision to vote for Option A.

Several questions were asked about the number of students projected for Lincoln Street School. MSBA has set 270 as the number, approximately thirty students fewer than the present student population. A good deal of discussion about the population number took place. Dr. Gobron and John Coderre explained the rationale for this number and assured those present that the Committee was comfortable with the projection.

Alan Minkus presented information about the costs of all the options that have been discussed. He later presented a more detailed timeline from 2012-2017.

A great deal of positive discussion took place about the work of the Building Committee and the direction the Committee is taking. The chairs and members of the town committees present applauded the work of the Lincoln Street Elementary School Building Committee and offered support for the project. Discussion also took place about information that would be helpful to present to the public as the project moves forward.

The meeting adjourned at 9:05 p.m.
