- Budget- insurance changes have saved the town close to 500K. Town and schools are working together closely to address the budget.
- Intern Updates: Clara Diebold, MS Intern, UMass Boston and Marie Wilsker, MSW Intern, Boston College, are both busy working in the schools. They are running two different social groups. They are working with another intern working through Southborough Youth & Family Services. Clara has 11 cases and has 12 clinical hours per week. Marie works 2 days per week.
- Recruitment Updates- Clinician Grant for 25K. Four applications have been received. Interviews are ongoing.
- There are two openings on the Youth Commission Board. All members are actively recruiting. Applications can be completed through Diane Wackell in the Town Administrator's office.

## Grants:

- MetroWest Community Health Care Foundation Grant Update:
  - June has met with all elementary principals letting them know about the Childhood Obesity Planning Grant. Tammy, the consultant hired for the grant, is pulling together the information gathered last spring in the focus group. The goal with the original grant is to identify

problems and opportunities in Northborough\_related to combating childhood obesity. From this a strategic plan will be developed to make recommendations. A continuation grant is being offered through MetroWest to extend this grant. The purpose of the continuation funds is to implement programs and activities in the community based on the results of the needs assessment.
