2. SELECTION OF COMMISSIONER FOR VACANT SEAT # 2

Douglas A Gibson and Sue Payne both put their name in to be chosen to fill the vacant commission seat 2. The Charter stated that since there were only three commissioners at the meeting then the vote for the vacant seat must be done by majority vote. (Section 4.08 Filling of Vacancies). A motion was made by Mayor Mary Lee Cook to appoint Douglas A. Gibson as the new Commissioner for seat 2. This Failed do to a lack of a second. A motion was made by Commissioner Hyatt and seconded by Commissioner Bittle to appoint Sue Payne as the new Commissioner for seat 2. The motion failed 2-1 with voting as follows: Mayor Cook, No; Commissioner Bittle, Yes; Commissioner Hyatt, Yes. Since the commission could not choose who would be seated, the commission chose to bring this up again at the next commission meeting. However if this is not solved at the next meeting it will go to a special election.

OAK HILL CHARTER 07/2009 UPDATED THROUGH SUPPL #2

ARTICLE VII. CITY ATTORNEY

[Sec. 7.01. Appointment; duties.]

There shall be a city attorney appointed by the commission, who may represent the city in all legal proceedings and shall perform all other duties assigned by the commission. The commission may remove the city attorney for any reason by motion requiring three affirmative votes.

ARTICLE VIII. POLICE

[Sec. 8.01. City responsibility for police services.]

The City of Oak Hill, Florida, shall provide adequate police services, either by a city police force or by an outside contractor, subject to the rules and regulations prescribed by the city commission by applicable ordinances and resolutions.

ARTICLE IX. ADVISORY BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

[Sec. 9.01. Authority of city commission.]

The city commission may at any time appoint advisory boards or committees, composed of citizens qualified to act in an advisory capacity to the city commission, the mayor, or to any department of the city government with respect to the conduct and the management of any property or institution or the exercise of any public functions of the city. The members of such boards or committees shall serve without compensation for the time fixed in their appointment, or at the pleasure of the city commission and their duties shall be to consult and advise the municipal officers and make written recommendations which shall become part of the records of the city.

ARTICLE X. LICENSES

[Sec. 10.01. Authority of city.]

The City of Oak Hill is authorized to levy and impose licenses and taxes by ordinance for the purpose of regulating and generating revenues, upon all occupations and upon any and all privileges and to create and fix the amounts to be paid; to provide for the collection of the same, and to provide penalties for failure and refusal to pay such licensed taxes. All such licensed taxes, so imposed, shall constitute a legal indebtedness to the city which may be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction, and no property of such debtor shall be exempt from forced sale, after due process of law to recover such indebtedness.

ARTICLE XI. ADMINISTRATIVE DEPARTMENTS

Sec. 11.01. Establishment of additional departments.

The commission may establish such other departments as it determines necessary for the efficient administration and operation of the city; such departments, offices or agencies shall be established by ordinance.

Laura and Jim:

Why is Mr. Perez's case different than Mr. Ihnken? I thought Chief presented the proposed termination of Mr Ihnken to the Personnel Board before it went to the Commission.

One of the purposes of the Personnel Board is to conduct hearings and mediate employment disputes. If the dispute is not resolved the Personnel Board shall issue a written report and recommendation to the Commission. I am not sure that an employee disputing proposed discipline would qualify as a employment dispute. However it is clear that the Personnel Board is involved in reviewing disciplinary action. It does not make sense to me that the Personnel Board would be involved in the review process of all disciplinary action except for termination. But it is not reasonable for the Commission to take action on the recommendation for termination and then the employee have the right to appeal the Commission's decision to the Personnel Board, who then makes a recommendation back to the Commission. Therefore if the Personnel Board is going to be involved in the review process of a proposed termination, it appears to me that the Personnel Board should hear the case and make a recommendation before it goes to the Commission.

There is no legal requirement for the City to have a personnel board. Therefore the Commission could eliminate the Personnel Board by adopting an ordinance. This would also require modification of the Personnel Manual, which the City is currently reviewing.

One consideration in eliminating the Personnel Board, is will the employees have the right to appeal disciplinary action? If yes the appeal could only be to the Commission. This is not much different than what the City currently has except the personnel issue would not go to the personnel board first. If the City did not have any process for employees to grieve employment disputes, this could result in the employees seeking union representation, which typically provides for binding arbitration.
