#### **RESOLUTION 2013-03**

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE PLANNING AREA BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT AND MEMBERSHIP REAPPORTIONMENT PLAN TO EXPAND THE METROPOLITAN PLANNING AREA BOUNDARY AND TO REAPPORTION THE VOTING MEMBERSHIP OF THE VOLUSIA TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION

Commissioner Engele also stated we should make sure that parts we buy for the mowers are of good quality.
