A. OPENING

Present at Roll Call: Mayor Douglas Gibson, Vice Mayor Jeff Bracy, Commissioners Kathy Bittle, Robert Livingston and Ron Engele.

- C. CITY ADMINISTRATION REPORTS
 - 1. Brent Millikan Contract Extension

Alex Kish of Brent Millikan informed the Commission that the City's current contract for auditing services has expired and he presented a contract extending those services to the 2015 fiscal year.

Vice Mayor Bracy made a motion and it was seconded by Commissioner Bittle to approve Brent Millikan's contract renewal for auditing services. Roll Call Vote: Mayor Gibson, Yes; Vice Mayor Bracy, Yes; Commissioner Engele, Yes; Commissioner Livingston, Yes; Commissioner Bittle, Yes. The motion carried, 5-0.

- 2. Jordan and Associates CDBG Small Cities Grant
- 1) Client # OH-08 (Howland) ACP Package #3 in the amount of \$8,915.80 requested by Conner Construction, LLC. Included within the attached file is a copy of the required Final Affidavit and Lien Waiver.
- 2) Client # OH-09 (Westberry) Temporary Relocation Payment #3 in the amount of \$105.44 requested by Mr. and Mrs. Westberry to offset storage costs incurred as a result of their involvement in the City's CDBG program.
- 3) Client # OH-08 (Howland) Payment of a lead clearance test with report performed by Lead Paint Solutions in the amount of \$275.00

Commissioner Engele made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Livingston, to approve the requests for payments as presented by Jordan and Associates. Roll Call Vote: Mayor Gibson, Yes; Vice Mayor Bracy, Yes; Commissioner Engele, Yes; Commissioner Livingston, Yes; Commissioner Bittle, abstained. The motion carried, 4-0.

Commissioner Engele inquired how much money was left in the Grant. Mr. Vanzant stated he would send that to the City Clerk.

Commissioner Bittle stated there seems to be some confusion in regards to the Howland project; there was a change order to reimburse the grant for carpet that was not used but she was under the impression that those funds were instead to be used to pay a portion of the refinishing of the wood floors.

Mayor Gibson inquired when the new grant cycle would be opened. Mr. Vanzant informed the Commission the new cycle would not open until December and if the Commission would like to reapply a 45 day notice would be sufficient to compile all the necessary paperwork. He also cautioned the Commission that their grant score would be slightly lower than the prior year due to already receiving the grant.

Commissioner Engele inquired about the status of the Comp Plan.

The City Planner stated that DEO is the only organization that hasn't replied with their comments, but she expects to hear from them soon.

Mr. Morehead, Scottsmoor, read a letter into record stating his property along River Road in Oak Hill has been mistakenly designated as Conservation and he would like it corrected.

Mayor Gibson requested this item to be placed on the next Agenda.

Mayor Gibson inquired about New Smyrna Beach annexing property over 10 acres; he was under the impression Cities could not annex over 10 acres at a time.

The City Planner stated if the property owner is voluntarily annexing the size of the property is not an issue.

Mayor Gibson stated both Edgewater and New Smyrna Beach have sent out letters encouraging property owners to annex into their cities and he feels Oak Hill should do the same. The Commission agreed.

The City Clerk asked the Commissioners to please assist her in compiling positive aspects of Oak Hill to include in that letter.

Commissioner Engele stated he was concerned with the placement of the Public Works building on the north side of the City Hall property, as he has observed that during hard rains the area floods.

Vice Mayor Bracy stated the contractor would know best in this matter and he volunteered to speak with Steelmasters about this matter. The Commission agreed.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF OAK HILL, VOLUSIA COUNTY, FLORIDA, ADOPTING ANIMAL LICENSING FEES TO BE CHARGED BY THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The City Clerk read Resolution 2013-04 by heading only.

Vice Mayor Bracy stated the cost for the two year license should be \$12 and not \$14.

After research and conversations with SJWMD, the County and the City Attorney it has been decided the property owner is well within his rights and he considers the issue closed.

Commissioner Bittle stated if the City does another CDBG Small Cities Grant the Commission needs to insure that issues that arose in the current grant are not repeated.

Vice Mayor Bracy thanked all who participated in the Motto contest and expressed his happiness with the chosen motto.
