F. CITY PLANNER ITEMS

1. Zoning Map 2014



Mayor Gibson stated the Commission will direct the PLDRC to go thru the process of amending the zoning classifications.

The mayor went on to suggest this item be turned over to Planning Solutions.



Commissioner Livingston concerned that the City still needs Montye Beamer's opinion and knowledge on the subject.



Vice Mayor stated his concern that Planning Solutions is not up to speed on this item and the cost to get them up to speed.



Helen Lavalley, Planning Solutions stated Montye has done quite a bit of research on the subject.



Beth Lemke, Planning Solutions stated if the Commission needs Planning Solutions to take over the Zoning map if necessary.

Vice Mayor, stated Montye Beamer has the knowledge and research to see the Zoning Map through. He went on to ask how soon this could be completed.

Montye Beamer stated the Zoning Map could be adopted as soon as the end of January.

Vice Mayor, questioned the properties along River Road seemed to be designated as B-2 zoning.

Mayor, stated as long as the Commission is in agreement to paying two planners on the zoning map.

1. Shoreline Restoration - Sunrise Park

Mayor, stated he met with Melinda Donnelley and Cynthia Livingston at Sunrise Park, in regards to the living shoreline grant. He went to explain he was told the grant does not allot funds for filling sand lost from erosion. The Mayor then spoke to a representative from DEP and they stated the City could file a permit to fill in the land and stated that would not be possible if grass and mangroves were planted.

The Commission agreed by consensus to reject the UCF's Living Shoreline Grant.

2. ORDINANCE #2014-06

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OAK HILL, FLORIDA, AMENDING ITS UNIFIED LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS, BY REZONING APPROXIMATELY 3.40 ACRES LOCATED ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF RIVER ROAD/CANAL AVENUE FROM R-1, LOW DENSITY RESIDENTIAL TO B-2, MARINE COMMERCIAL; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; REPEALING ALL LAWS OR PARTS OF LAWS IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND PROVIDING WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT.
