

# **ORDINANCE NO. 2016-03**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OAK HILL, VOLUSIA COUNTY, FLORIDA AMENDING CHAPTER 24 ARTICLE II. (RULES OF INTERPRETATION AND DEFINITIONS): SECTION 24-40 (DEFINITIONS) TO PROVIDE DEFINITIONS RELATED TO ANIMAL CONTROL; ARTICLE V. (ZONING: USE, DENSITY AND INTENSITY) SECTIONS 24-501 (SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS) AMENDING CRITERIA FOR KENNELS; CHAPTER 8 ARTICLE II (ANIMAL CONTROL) SEC. 8-19 (DEFINITIONS) AMENDING DEFINITION RELATED TO ANIMAL CONTROL; CREATING SECTION 8-42 (LIMITATION ON NUMBER OF ANIMALS) OF THE CITY OF OAK HILL CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTING PROVISIONS, SEVERABILITY AND APPLICABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE. ## **ORDINANCE #2016-08**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OAK HILL, FLORIDA, AMENDING ITS FUTURE LAND USE, BY CHANGING APPROXIMATELY 6.15 ACRES LOCATED ON EAST HALIFAX AVENUE FROM LOW DENSITY RESIDENTIAL TO AGRICULTURE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; REPEALING ALL LAWS OR PARTS OF LAWS IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND PROVIDING WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT.

Motion: To approve Ordinance 2016-08, Moved by Commissioner Bittle, Seconded by Commissioner Hyatt. Motion passed unanimously.

### **ORDINANCE #2016-09**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OAK HILL, FLORIDA, AMENDING ITS UNIFIED LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS, BY REZONING APPROXIMATELY 6.15 ACRES LOCATED ON E HALIFAX AVENUE FROM LOW DENSITY RESIDENTIAL (R-1) TO AGRICULTURAL (A-1);

PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; REPEALING ALL LAWS OR PARTS OF LAWS IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND PROVIDING WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT.

Motion: To approve Ordinance 2016-09, Moved by Commissioner Bittle, Seconded by Commissioner Hyatt. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **ORDINANCE #2016-10**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OAK HILL, VOLUSIA COUNTY, FLORIDA REPEALING CHAPTER 26 (OFFENSES), ARTICLE III (SEX OFFENDERS); ADOPTING A NEW ARTICLE III (SEXUAL OFFENDER RESIDENCY RESTRICTIONS; EXCEPTIONS AND PENALTIES); PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Motion: To approve Ordinance 2016-10, Moved by Commissioner Bittle, Seconded by Commissioner Hyatt. Motion passed unanimously.

### I. NEW BUSINESS

## 1. Proposal - Sunrise Park

Mayor stated he received a proposal from Larry Csonka and he proceeded to read it into record (letter is attached to minutes)

The Mayor stated a counter would look favorable to a judge if this was to go to court. His suggestion would be for \$3000 per foot.

Commissioner Livingston stated he is not in favor of selling any portion of the Sunrise Park.

Vice Mayor Bracy stated the City of Oak Hill bought the park property fairly with due diligence; therefore he is confident the City is in the right and he does not see a reason to sell any portion.

Barney Dillard, builder for Neal Goodrich and Larry Csonka; stated everything was fine until the fence was placed on the park property. He went on to state he has a survey from 1986 which is in conflict with the City; and yet Mr. Csonka would like to enter negotiations to hopefully end this issue amicably.

Jimmy Vann, 127 South Gaines Street and previous owner of Sunrise Park, stated the proposal before the commission is well below the original offer of \$31,000. He went on to state if the Commission agrees to sell any portion of that park you will need to explain to the citizens of Oak Hill why it is being sold.

The Mayor agreed with Mr. Vann that this property was bought for the citizens and that should be the most important.

The Commission agreed to send a letter to Mr. Csonka declining the offer.
