Ken Deforest, WastePro representative stated the contract he is in receipt of does not include the storm debris wording. Mr. Deforest gave a copy of his document to the City.

The Mayor stated he sees the best way to move forward is to issue a Request for Proposal (RFP).

The Commission agreed to include everything in the current contract and include garbage cans and storm debris in the RFP.

Ken Deforest stated the City has some time before a decision needs to made and he asked the Commission to consider sitting down with WastePro to see if an agreement could be made. If no agreement is made then the City will still have time to issue a RFP.

The Commission agreed to give WastePro time to give the City a proposal.

Don Collins with Republic Services stated it has been a pleasure listening to the Commission give a waste company compliments and it looks as if the City is happy with WastePro. He went on to say his company will be happy to work with the City if they are not able to reach an agreement with their current provider.
