# B. PRESENTATIONS - Volusia County Councilwoman Deb Denys

Volusia County Councilwoman Deb Denys came to speak to the Commission giving an update regarding the efforts to clean up the lagoon. She stated that the county is actively helping the City with a few things, wastewater collection transmission document and also the county is contracted with Mead and Hunt for the \$61,000 task assignment completion. Councilwoman Denys also spoke about Burns Sci-tech working with the county to put in a larger pipe when they pull the sewer line down US Hwy 1 to the school. That way if citizens would like to hook into the line, they would be able to. She stated that there is also an application to the Indian River Lagoon Council for the City for phase 1 of the wastewater project with is for Indian Harbor estates for the sewer project. Councilwoman Denys stated that we still have line items in Tallahassee for \$250,000 in the House of Representatives because of the help of Representative Santiago and the senate side we have \$100,000 due to the efforts of Senator Debbie Mayfield. Lastly, she stated she looks forward to working with the City towards our effort towards water quality.

# F. CITY PLANNER ITEMS

1. Special Exception- Outdoor Storage- US Hwy 1 and Ariel Rd

Deputy City Clerk explained the Special Exception application which is for outdoor storage and display of goods at its location stated above. It went to the PLDRC and they came back with a few recommendations.

- Implicate the section 24-501-(20) D- which stated that you have to put a fence abutting any residential area. They want to also make it apply to the US Hwy 1 corridor. In which the fence is solid (not chain-link).
- No hazardous material on site.
- Also, have a timeline made for the different phases, in which they wanted the commission to come up with.

Building Official Dennis Fischer stated that the applicant has met all the criteria that is needed for the Special Exception application. He reiterated what the PLDRC would like to see that Commission implement. Lastly, he stated the four different phases of the application.

Applicant Keegan Greene explained that he went to the PLDRC meeting and what the discussion was. He stated that he would like to possibly put up a metal fence to match the look of the whole business. But that he and his business partner are willing to work with the City in any way.

Mayor Gibson stated he would like to see a solid fence in the east, north and south. Chain-link is fine for the back of the property. He stated he wanted an 8 foot fence but he was told by staff that only a 6 foot fence is allowed but that we can require a 2 foot berm and then a 6 foot fence on top of that.

Motion: To approve the special exception with what the PLDRC recommended (See above), no Semi trucks, add 2 foot berm to the 6 foot fencing, no outdoor storage near the storage buildings, and no permit issued except clearing until the Commission approves a phase agreement with a timeline and site plan.
