STATUS OF THE STATE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER - ACTIVATED MODERATE TO HEAVY SNOWSTORM UNDERWAY ACROSS OUR AREA...

At 10:00 AM radar showed moderate to occasionally heavy snow falling across most of the state. Bands of heavy snow are moving thru western and eastern CT. Road conditions are wet in the valleys and snow covered in the higher elevations. Total snowfall thus far ranges from 2" - 6" across the state. Temperatures currently range from 30 - 35 F across the state. NE winds are sustained at 10 – 15 MPH with gusts to 30 MPH inland and 41 MPH along the coast at times. Eversource and UI are currently reporting a total of 1,836 outages mainly in eastern CT.

This Morning: Moderate snow is expected across the state with heavy bands of snow in the Western and Eastern Hills. The impact on morning travel is expected to range from minor in the valleys to moderate in the higher elevations. Roads in eastern CT are likely to have several inches of snow cover. Roads in the Hartford / New Haven areas will likely have a lighter snow cover and slush combination. Roads in western CT are forecast to have a coating of snow and slush. The snow is forecast to continue thru the morning to be lighter in Western CT and heavier in Eastern CT. Temperatures are forecast to hold in the low 30's with North winds gusting to 30 MPH inland and 40 MPH along the coast at times.

This Afternoon: The snow intensity is forecast to lighten up by early afternoon and end from southwest to northeast between 4:00 – 8:00 PM. The impact on the afternoon rush hour is expected to range from very minor in western CT, minor in central CT and moderate in eastern CT. Roads in eastern CT are likely to have a few inches of remaining snow on the shoulders, ramps and secondary roads. Roads in the Hartford / New Haven areas will likely have been plowed and have a light snow cover and slush combination. Roads in western CT are forecast to have been plowed and have a light coating of slush on the shoulders and ramps.

Total snowfall from this storm is forecast to range from 4" - 8" in Western CT, 6" - 12" in Central CT and 10" – 14" in Eastern CT.

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, Division of Emergency Management and Homeland Security will continue to closely monitor this storm. The next update will be sent out at 12:15 PM.
