At the last meeting I also explained my fear of large trucks on Bokum rd. The issue not only is that these trucks will cause traffic and potential life threatening car accidents, it is that these trucks will be on my road for a long period of perhaps 3 years or more.

While the land clearing will not take 3 years the construction of these houses will. This means a constant headache for the neighborhood and people just trying to use Bokum Rd to access Essex and ~~the~~ Westbrook.

An issue that I also see is that the endangered and at risk species like the spotted salamander will be ~~be~~ diminished. I can attest to this because when the abutting Saybrook ridge ~~of~~ a subplot divisions were ~~put in~~ dug for test holes, they were filled with water. These test holes were allowed to sit for days until they ran dry. Every year following I have not been able to find one spotted salamander in my yard a quarter mile away. Prior to the test holes I could lift any rock and find one. I am no expert on biology however I am not a novice on the issue either. This is no coincidence. If such impact was done from just digging test holes imagine the damage on the vernal pools and wetlands that lay next to the proposed road to be built. We saw them dry as a group however if you see them in the rainy months like April they are full and flourishing with amphibians. The projected number of housing units is far higher than ~~what we are~~ than the 9 on Bokum road. The 9 houses to my understanding are just to show the potential Riversound has to sell more.

houses in the future. While 9 houses may sell along
with the others on Ingham after ~~a~~ a long time on the ^{Page 3}
Market, with the way the housing market is there is
no way all 221 will sell. Its not coincidence
that every court has denied the old plan. What I want
everyone to remember is that once these few
"test houses" as I call them are allowed to be
built, there is no undo button. Once you
let the camel's nose under the tent there's not
much ~~left~~ keeping the rest of the body from
following. What makes Old Saybrook unique
is not the number of large developments
and golf courses. It is the rich environmental
resources such as the Connecticut River, Long Island
Sound, and at stake, "the preserve".
lets keep Old Saybrook the way it is, historic,
quiet and unique.
