#### 1. <u>BUDGET UPDATE</u>

Tabled.

#### 2. <u>OLD BUSINESS</u>

Tabled; the Subcommittee did not have an update available.

#### 3. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

#### a. Review Bid Results

**i. PG** distributed a tabulation of the bid results with cost and quantity breakdowns; he confirmed that the apparent low bidder, Scope Construction, listed quantities that closely matched his

material takeoffs, which indicated Scope had looked at the plans and understood the scope of work. **KB** stated that he had worked with Scope Construction and they were a competent and reliable firm; he stated that he had spoken to Scope briefly and they were comfortable with their bid despite the large range of the bids received.

- **ii.** Bid Alternate No.1 was discussed and **NP** described the HardiePanel siding and it's material advantages. **NP** will try to get samples of the base bid vinyl shake siding and the HardiePanel for the scope review or Special Meeting on 30 Jun 16. **DB** stated the small premium for the material seemed well worth the long term benefits.
- **iii.** Bid Alternate No. 2 for the overhead doors was discussed; the general consensus was that the sliding barn doors in the Base Bid were preferable functionally and aesthetically.
- **iv.** Bid Alternate No. 3 was discussed, as was the possibility of going to prefabricated fiberglass cupolas; **NP** stated the problem with the fiberglass was that it couldn't be painted and the planned dark green trim color would have to be integral to the gel coat. **PG** stated this item was small enough that it was not time-critical and could be incorporated as a change after the contract was awarded if desired.
- **v.** All present were in favor of Bid Alternate No. 4 for the reinforced turf at the south side of the building.
- vi. GH asked why there was such a wide range of pricing for the Alternates:
  - Alternate No. 1 had a \$61,000 range,
  - Alternate No. 2 had a \$49,000 range,
  - Alternate No. 3 had an \$8,000 range,
  - Alternate No. 4 had a \$28,000 range.

**PG** and **KB** could offer no explanation other than apparently several of the bidders did not look at the job carefully enough to price the work competitively.

**KB** stated that Scope Construction was available to meet Tuesday, 28 June or Thursday, 30 June. The scope review is scheduled for 2:00 p.m., Tuesday, 28 Jun 16 at Town Hall.
