

**Architectural Review Committee  
October 22, 2009**

Meeting called to order at 6:30 p.m.

**BP/Green Valley Oil**, 96 Route 6A. Represented by David Kelly. Proposes three signs. 1). Pylon – internally lit, 6'x6' square sign. Colors – BP pearl background, three different shades of green, yellow and white for helio (logo). 2). Building sign – paint BP Pearl, 5' elliptical metal sign, not illuminated. Font – white, background – green. 3). Canopy – three 3' diameter helios – same color, texture, plastic internally laminated. Canopy to be painted BP Pearl. Paint canopy columns BP Pearl, bollards - yellow/darker grey. Pumps overlaid with BP branded grade decals – logo bottom, bp helios on top – dispenser color – blue. **Pat made a motion to approve with modifications – design, graphics and color of pylon sign were approved. However, size, location and height were to be determined by Building Commissioner. Sign – front right of building 5' elliptical sign. Canopy – two “helios” logo on gable ends. All lighting – down lit – gooseneck. Entire building to be painted BP Pearl. Dispensers are to be referred to Building Commissioner – do logos constitute signage? Carolyn seconded and the vote was 5-0-0.**

**Orleans Marketplace**, 130/136 Route 6A. Represented by Todd Thayer. Proposes two additional smaller ladder signs – 32 square feet. Existing ladder sign to remain unchanged. **Carolyn made a motion to approve as submitted with modification – if existing trees are a hindrance – they are to be moved to another site on property. Will seconded and the vote was 5-0-0.**

**OLD/NEW BUSINESS**

**Pat made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 8, 2009. Will seconded and the vote was 5-0-0.**

Discussion of the ZBA overturning the Building Commissioner's denial of The Lost Dog Pub's pre-existing free-standing sign.
