Call to Order:

A quorum was established and the meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Barbara Natale. The meeting was held in the Trustees' Room at Snow Library.

- Absent: Trustee Tim Traub, Student Representative Alexandra Malloy and Selectman Liaison Sue Christie.

Approval of minutes:

• The minutes, of the Trustees Meeting held April 10, 2012, were reviewed. A motion was made and seconded to "approve the minutes as presented". The motion carried with a vote 6(Y)-0(N)-0(A)

Trustee Chair Report

- Barbara Natale spoke of a discussion with members of the OCP and their appreciation of all the Library has done and the volume of events that take place at the Library.
- Natale also mentioned Tim Traub's letter (which is included as part of the Town Meeting Report) was
 impressive, as well as the HK Cummings pictures which were included as part of the report.

Student Representative Report

Financial Report:

Sandra Rhodes presented the March 2012 Monthly Report (copy attached):

- Depletion Accounts: Salaries included 5 weeks of payroll. Operating Expenses included payments of \$3k for books and materials, \$1k for electricity, \$1k for supplies and \$3k for repairs and maintenance. Friends-Museum Passes included \$475 for the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston.
- Revolving Accounts: State Aid reflected a payment of \$2k for an online database. Contributions/Gifts reflected \$3k spent on books and materials and \$1k for video games. The Kline Foundation included payments of \$427.63 for Legos in the Children's Area.
- A motion was made and seconded "to accept the Financial Report as presented". The motion carried with a vote 6-0-0.

Library Director's Report:

Director Mary Reuland reviewed the May 2012 report (copy attached) and the following were discussed:

- Brotherton Grant: Director has a meeting with Dr. Brotherton next Thursday. All events are scheduled except for one week.
- Meeting Room Requests: Discussion was held concerning a Poetry Slam being held at the Library and an advertisement which stated a \$20 entrance fee. Director has spoken with the organizer of the event and the advertising will be changed to 'free and open to the public'. A discussion was held regarding the wording of 'Sold Out', which implies that a fee was charged to attend. The wording 'Course is Full' would be more appropriate to convey that Library courses are free and open to all. The Library Meeting Room Policy states that all events are free and open to the public. Adding the wording of 'No Fee can be Charged' to the Meeting Room Policy Request Form was discussed.
- Front Doors: The Charter at Town Meeting approved funding to fix the front doors. Since the Library would be closed for a couple of days while the work is completed, the bidding process should include wording that work must be completed by Oct 1.
- Summer Children's Programs: A few changes will be made to summer children's programs. A Pajama story time will be held on Wednesday nights at 6:30. Story time and craft will be held on Thursdays and an additional program will be held on Tuesday nights. Morning programs have had low attendance, so a shift to evening programs for the summer will be made.
- Facility Advisory Committee: A new committee will start up in June and members will be voted on during the June Board Meeting.

A motion was made and seconded "to accept the Director's Report as presented". The motion carried with a vote 6-0-0.

Report of Friends' Representative:

- Friends' Representative, Carol Courneen reported on the following matters:
 - Friends have taped a PSA (public service announcement) segment on Channel 17, Town Video site. This is a 30 second looping PSA with includes multiple non-profits. This will be updated every 3 months with a new version.
 - Matthew Pearl, the author of "The Technologist", has been selected as the speaker for the Friends Book and Author Luncheon which will take place on Thursday, May 24th at the Jailhouse Restaurant in Orleans.
 - Friends is looking for donated space to store books for the Book Sale.

Other Reports:

Craine Gallery Committee:

- Megan Fates updated the Trustees on the efforts of the Craine Gallery Committee:
 - The Craine Gallery Committee has received applications from 2 interested parties for the open positions on the Committee.
 - The Committee will advertise the open positions on the Library website.
 - Next meeting of the Craine Gallery Committee will be held on May 16, 2012.

Director's Report

Personnel

State aid payment

The final check of the State Aid to Public Libraries is being made this month and Snow Library will receive \$ 4,109.23. The total received for this year will be \$8,081.28

Building

Exterior repairs on the front have improved the appearance of the building. The work will probably have to be done again next spring since the columns were only patched and painted, not replaced with fiberglass columns. The power washing should be in the maintenance budget for each year.

The replacement of the front door will go to bid again if the transfer of funds is approved at Town Meeting. Funds were transferred from heating repairs to provide enough funds to get the door replaced.

Summer@Snow program


Schedule of events is included. Last year, Trustees introduced the speakers and it would be good to do that again this year. Each Trustee selected one event to introduce.
