Those monies are to be used for improvements as recommended by the 2015 Road Committee on the following roads: Bell Hill Road, Gore Road, Peaco Hill Road, Powhatan Road, and Rayville Road.

(Based on the 2014 Tax Rate Calculation form, and everything else held constant, the

increase to the mill rate, for this article only, would be an estimated \$.0013 per dollar or \$1.30 per thousand assessed value.)

This article alone will increase the present mill rate by approximately 10%.

\$408,000 will increase the mill rate by an estimated \$.00146 per dollar or \$1.46 per thousand assessed value.)

Proposed Ordinance Change All structures built after June 21, 2008 shall have a front set back a distance of 50 feet from the property pins. If the surveyed property line is not known, the setback shall be 75 feet from the center of the traveled way as determined by the Code Enforcement Officer. Provided, however, that in a shoreland zone, where a structure that is nonconforming with a water setback is to be relocated, reconstructed or replaced, the minimum front setback shall be 25 feet from the property pins unless the surveyed property line is unknown, in which case the front setback shall be 50 feet from the center of the travelled way as determined by the Code Enforcement Officer. An accessory structure of 50 square feet or less that is not fastened to the ground is exempted from the Building Ordinance. An entry way of 50 square feet or less is exempted from the setback requirements and shall not be used as the nearest point reference for future expansions. Any expansion cannot get closer to the property line than the nearest point of the existing structure.
