Western Foothills Land Trust update:

There have been two small harvests on Watkins South. Wood has not gone to the Mill as Mills are not doing well and loggers are holding on to trees because the price is so low at the moment.

There has been one harvest on the Oak Hill parcel.

Trails could go on the Green Lot. This lot has a lot of wetlands. WFLT has acquired Mitigation Fund money for this property. The property will be split in two with a portion being a working forest, and 150 acres as forever wild. This might be a place to have trails and programs. This property has a lot of vernal pools and resources that are worth protecting.

Fogg parcel connector getting appraisal.

Lee attended a workshop on climate change, Open Space Institute looks at the complexity of landscapes and watersheds to look at what needs to be protected. Lee feels the place that OCC could be most effective is with the Twin Bridges. The harvest schedule will be on the northern portion this summer and southern portion this winter. This parcel is flat and has good access. A parking lot will eventually be put in. There is a small bit of frontage on Little Pond. Things that the OCC can help with now are assisting with a few events scheduled for the summer: Saturday, July 30, from 9 to 11 paddle on Little Pond.
