#### Percentage of Increase In Millage Over Roll-Back Rate:

The City of Pahokee's Percentage Increase in Millage over Rolled-Back Rate is 5.06%. Fiscal Year 2018-2019 rolled-back taxes are \$537,435 (95% budgeted = \$510,563) and Fiscal Year 2018-2019 proposed taxes are \$564,604 (95% budgeted = \$536,374). Fiscal Year 2018-2019 proposed tax increase is \$26,739 and Fiscal Year 2018-2019 rolled-back rate is 6.2271. The Fiscal Year 2017-2018 millage rate was 6.5419 and Fiscal Year 2018-2019 proposed millage is 6.5419. The Fiscal Year 2017-2018 proposed millage decrease is 0.00 and the 2017-2018 rolled-back rates was 6.4869.

### ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION RELATING TO FINAL MILLAGE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018-2019

#### **RESOLUTION 2018 - 54**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, FLORIDA, FIXING THE FINAL MILLAGE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2018-2019 ON ALL TAXABLE REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY TO PROVIDE FOR GENERAL OPERATING EXPENSES, AND DECLARING A TAX LEVY UPON SAID PROPERTY.

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Pahokee, Florida, on September 11, 2018, adopted Fiscal Year Tentative Millage Rates following a public hearing as required by Florida Statute 200.065; and

WHEREAS, The City of Pahokee of Palm Beach County, Florida, held a public hearing as required by Florida Statute 200.065; and

WHEREAS, the gross taxable value for the operating purposes not exempt from taxation within Palm Beach County has been certified by the County Property Appraiser to the City of Pahokee as \$86,305,874; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Pahokee, Florida, finds and determines that it is necessary for taxes to be levied upon all taxable real and personal property in the City of Pahokee, Florida in order to meet the obligations incident to providing for the orderly conduct of governmental business of the city, the peace and good order in the City and for the payment of general operating expenses of the government of the City; and

WHEREAS, an assessment has been made to determine the taxable real and personal property in the City.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, THAT:

- There is hereby levied, upon all taxable real and personal property in the City of Pahokee, Florida which is not expressly exempt from taxation, a proposed tax determined and fixed at 6.5419 dollars per thousand dollars and part thereof of the value fixed by the Property Appraiser.
- Section 2. The levy of 6.5419 Mills is greater than the rolled back rate of 6.2271 by 5.06 percent.

Section 3. This resolution shall apply as a levy of taxes for the calendar year 2018 upon all the taxable real and personal property located in the City of Pahokee, Palm Beach County, Florida.

### ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION RELATING TO FINAL MUNICIPAL BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR

#### 2018 - 2019

#### **RESOLUTION 2018 - 55**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, FLORIDA, RELATING TO FINANCES, PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION AND FUNDING OF THE FINAL MUNICIPAL BUDGET IN THE AMOUNT OF \$4,654,341 OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, FLORIDA, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2018, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2019.

**WHEREAS**, the adoption and implementation of a final fiscal budget to provide municipal expenses for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2018, and ending September 30, 2019, for the City of Pahokee, Florida is essential.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, THAT:

- 1. The City of Pahokee, Florida, hereby adopts for the fiscal year, beginning October 1, 2018, and ending September 30, 2019, the following final fund budgets.
- 2. The City Commission finds and determines that the sums set forth in the following final fund budgets are necessary to preserve the Public Health, Public Peace, and Public Welfare of the City of Pahokee, Florida, and are necessary for it to properly function as a City.
- (a) There is hereby appropriated for the General Fund of the City of Pahokee, Florida for the above-described fiscal year, the total sum of Four Million, Three Hundred Four Thousand, Nine Hundred Twenty-Two Dollars (\$4,304,922) to provide for the budget of the General Fund.
- (b) There is hereby appropriated from the Henderson Endowment Special Revenue Fund of the City of Pahokee, Florida for the above-described fiscal year the sum of One Thousand, Three Hundred Fifteen Dollars (\$1,315) to the General Fund budget.
- (c) There is hereby established for the budget of the Marina Campground Fund of the City of Pahokee, Florida for the above-described fiscal year the total sum of One Hundred Forty-Seven Thousand, One Hundred Ninety-Eight Dollars (\$147,198).
- (d) There is hereby established for the budget of the Cemetery Fund of the City of Pahokee, Florida for the above-described fiscal year the total sum of Two Hundred Thousand, Nine Hundred Six Dollars (\$200,906).

#### **NOTICE**

3. This RESOLUTION providing for said fiscal year set forth above is adopted to cover said period of time only.

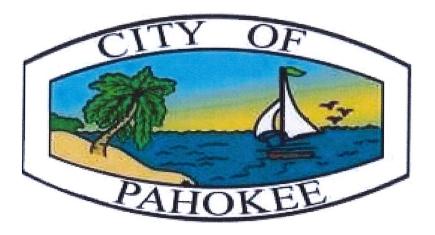

RE: Budget FY2018-2019

Dear Mayor Babb, and Members of City Commission,

I'm pleased to present the proposed operating budget for the City of Pahokee for fiscal year 2018 through September 30th 2019. It is a balanced budget that proposes revenues and expenditures totaling \$4,654,341. This budget provides provision of public funds in the City of Pahokee for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2018. The current budget has been developed in accordance with all City policy directives, State and Federal laws.

This budget has been prepared with the goal of maintaining a high level of services to our community. However, it's commensurate with financial resources available to fund those services, and with realistic budget requests for expenditures and conservative estimates on revenue. As with all professional pubic administrators; management has utilized the following standard guidelines and criteria in preparation of this budget:

- Provide for high quality services while maintaining a fiscally responsible government.
- Maintain or increase the unrestricted fund balance thereby placing the City in a fiscal position to resolve emergencies and unforeseen expenses for infrastructure.
- Prepare for adverse financial conditions in the next five (5) to ten (10) years.
- Continue establishing the credibility of the City of Pahokee as a viable community with a strong fiscal future.

#### Major Funds

This budget consists of major fund accounts, including the General Fund, Henderson Endowment Special Revenue Fund, Marina Campground Fund, and Cemetery Fund. Surtax Funds are allocated for particular projects and are not a part of our general expenses.

#### **Debt Services**

The City of Pahokee is currently holding no long term outstanding debt to independent entities. The City anticipates future infrastructure projects may incur debt holdings. Those holdings will be assessed under the surtax funds allocated to Pahokee; thus reducing risk of debts going unsatisfied. Other services will be addressed through grant development and legislative priorities

#### Tax Base and Millage Rate

The City of Pahokee current year property gross taxable value FY 2018 has been estimated by the Palm Beach County Tax Appraiser at \$81,994,375. Last year the City's millage rate was at 6.5419 per \$1,000 of assessed value. This generated \$509,635 in Ad valorem revenue to the City of Pahokee. This year the tentative millage will remain the same as last year at 6.5419. This will generate \$536,430 in ad valorem revenue to the City in this fiscal year.

#### **Budget Conclusion**

As we look to the future, the focus will be on public service delivery and economic development involving both legislative and economic considerations. Capital Improvement planning is one of the key areas that require a consistent commitment. Capital planning includes maintaining infrastructure systems, repairing the current issues that affront us and investing in valued neighborhoods.

The following is the administration's 2020 plan first envisioned in 2015:

- Neighborhood Revival—creating and encouraging renewal, prosperity and stabilization of property values and keeping residents informed.
- 2. **Economic Development**—promoting business development and enhancing the standard of living by engaging new partners for Pahokee.
- 3. **Protecting Eco-Tourism and Investment** envision and focus on maintaining our code of ordinances, improving long-term resources, while enhancing safety, protecting water, and forecasting unforeseen needs.
- 4. **Responsive Government**—ensuring local government is transparent, ethical, and responsive to the public by pursuing policies that are accountable to stakeholders. And by ensuring the public's resources are protected and utilized at its maximum for a results oriented conclusion.
- Community Development—developing strategies and a process which aims to provide affordable, clean, energy-saving alternatives for today's residents in terms of housing and rental properties.
- 6. Public/Private Partnership-strengthening our relationships with Palm Beach County, state elected officials and our federal partners to ensure every funding stream is identified. Ensuring we connect with private developers for Pahokee's economic vitality.

Pahokee recognizes that a conservative and abstract management approach was needed to balance the budget, create a morale among employees that's unwavering to the Public Service motto, and to develop a theme "Progress Pahokee" which supports the statement of building a city and community of choice in Palm Beach County.

I would like thank the Director of Finance and the department staff, including the Mayor and Commission for this year's fiscal budget for the great City of Pahokee

### **ORDINANCE NO. 2018 - 04**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, FLORIDA, PROHIBITING THE PARKING OF CERTAIN VEHICLES IN RESIDENTIAL ZONING DISTRICTS, INCLUDING THE CORE DISTRICT; PROVIDING A CONFLICTS CLAUSE, PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND EFFECTIVE DATE.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE THAT:

- Section 1. Section 22-21 of the Code of Laws and Ordinances of the City is hereby created to read as follows:
  - Sec. 22-21 Parking or Storage of Commercial Vehicles, Trucks, and Similar Vehicles Prohibited in Residential Zoning Districts, including the CORE District
  - A. It shall be unlawful for any agent, operator, owner or person in charge of any pole trailer, semi-trailer, trailer coach or truck in excess of One Ton rated capacity, truck trailer, or industrial equipment trailer, to park, store, or keep such motor vehicle or trailer on any public street, avenue, alley, or other thoroughfare, or any right-of-way within any residential zoning district or in the CORE district in the City for a period exceeding one hour in any 24-hour period.
  - B. It shall be unlawful for the owner of the property in any residential zoning district or in the CORE zoning district in the City to park on, or cause to be parked on, or allow to be parked on any residential-zoned or CORE-zoned property in the City or in the streets, alleys or parkways abutting the property, any pole trailer, semi-trailer, trailer coach or truck in excess of One Ton rated capacity, truck trailer, or industrial equipment trailer, for a period exceeding one hour in any 24-hour period unless as part of a business that is legally permitted or existing as of the date of adoption of this ordinance.
  - C. The restrictions of subsections (A) and (B) above shall not apply to the temporary parking of such vehicles or trailers on private property in residential zoning districts or in the CORE zoning district whereon construction is underway. A current and valid building permit issued by the City must be properly displayed on the premises.
  - D. The restrictions of subsection (A) and (B) above of one hour in residential zoning districts and the CORE zoning district shall not apply to routine deliveries by tradesmen, or the use of trucks in making service calls, providing such time in excess of one hour is actually in the course of business deliveries or servicing.
  - E. The restrictions of subsection (A) and (B) above shall not apply to vehicles or trailers which become disabled, and as a result of such emergency are required to be parked within a residential zoning district or a CORE zoning district longer than one hour. Any disabled vehicle or trailer, however, shall be removed from the residential zoning district or the CORE zoning district within 24 hours, by a wrecker if necessary, regardless of the nature of the emergency.

Conflict. All sections or parts of sections of the revised Code of Ordinances in conflict Section 2. herewith are intended to be repealed to the extent of such conflict. If any section, subsection, clause or provision of this Ordinance is Section 2. declared unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder shall not be affected by such invalidity. Inclusion in the Code of Ordinances. It is the intention of the City Commission, and Section 4. it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and are made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Pahokee, that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered to accomplish such intentions; and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "Section" or other appropriate word. AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 17-216 OF THE CODE OF LAWS AND ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, PROVIDING FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF CITY NOISE ORDINANCE VIOLATIONS BY LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS OF THE STATE OF FLORIDA; PROVIDING A CONFLICTS CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, AND EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, presently violations of Chapter 17, Article III, are punishable exclusively by code enforcement citations, making it difficult for Florida Law Enforcement officers to effectively enforce this law.

### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE THAT:

Section 1. The title to Section 17-216of the Codes and Laws and Ordinances of the City of Pahokee is amended to read:

Sec. 17-216 Enforcement: notice of violation.

Section 2. Section 17-216(c) of the Codes of Laws and Ordinances of the City of Pahokee is amended to read:

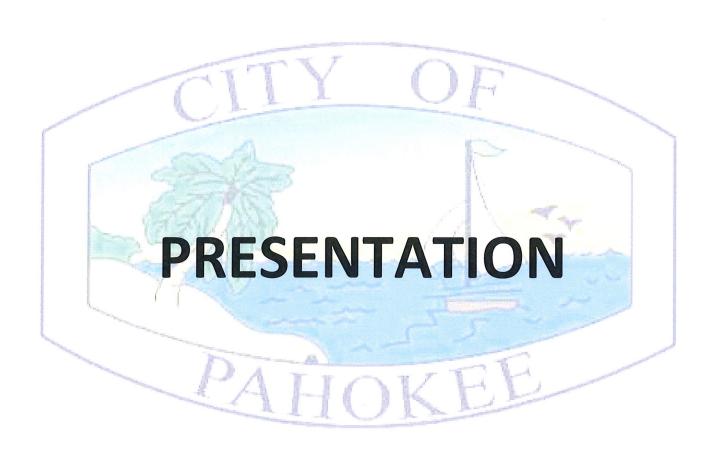
Enforcement by law enforcement officers. A law enforcement officer, authorized to enforce the laws of the state within the city limits of Pahokee, may enforce the provisions of sections 17-206 to 17-216including through the issuance of a notice to appear. Any violations of the provisions of this article, if enforced by a law enforcement officer, shall be prosecuted as a misdemeanor of the second degree and punished by a fine of not more than five-hundred dollars (\$500.00) and/or imprisonment in an authorized facility for not more than (60) days.

- **Section 3. Repeal of Laws in Conflict.** All sections or parts of sections of the revised Code of Ordinances in conflict herewith are intended to be repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- **Section 4. Severability**. If any section, subsection, clause or provision of this ordinance is declared unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder shall not be affected by such invalidity.
- **Section 5. Inclusion in the Code of Ordinances.** It is the intention of the City Commission, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and are made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Pahokee, that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intentions; and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section" or other appropriate word.
- **Section 6. Effective Date.**This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage by the City Commission in second reading.

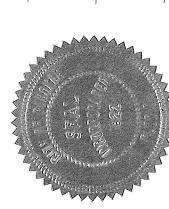

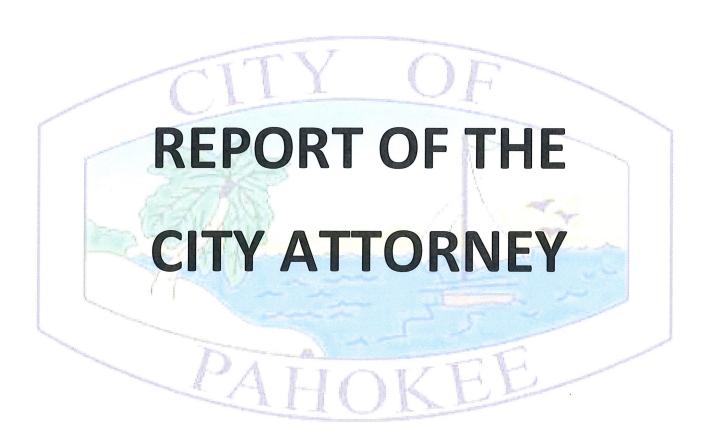

Wickham Rd., Suite 500, Melbourne, FL 32940 ("CCHAMPIONS",) and the City of Pahokee, a State of Florida municipal corporation, with an address at 207 Begonia Drive Pahokee, FL 33476.

### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, because of an overwhelming number of mortgage foreclosures on residential and commercial properties that are in violation of the City of Pahokee City Code of Ordinances, more specifically Ordinance 2010-07, the care of neglected lawns and exterior maintenance of structures is becoming a health and welfare issue in the City of Pahokee; and,

WHEREAS, in order to promptly and efficiently address the issues related to the maintenance of foreclosed residential and commercial properties; the City Commission adopted Ordinance "10-07," the City's Property Registration Ordinance ("Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Ordinance the CITY desires to enter into this Agreement with CCHAMPIONS in order to provide services authorized pursuant to the Ordinance "2010-07," to register vacant, abandoned, and foreclosed properties so that the CITY can properly address violations of the CITY's property maintenance codes (hereinafter "foreclosed property").

WHEREAS, CCHAMPIONS will also provide an electronic registration process that is cost-free and revenue-generating for the CITY.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, and for other valuable consideration received, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

### I. CCHAMPIONS RESPONSIBILITIES.

A. CCHAMPIONS will cite the CITY's Ordinance to mortgagees and proactively contact those that file a public notice of default, lis pendens, foreclosure action, and or take title to real property via foreclosure or other any legal means. CCHAMPIONS will electronically provide for registration of foreclosed properties in violation of applicable CITY ordinances.

B. CCHAMPIONS will pay for all expenses related to registration of all foreclosed property, and all administrative costs and fees related thereto. CCHAMPIONS will investigate, report, or take corrective measures monthly to

update property status of all foreclosed property electronically registered and in compliance with the relevant CITY ordinances.

- C. CCHAMPIONS will charge a fee as directed by the CITY to each Registrant to register all mortgagees who comply with the Ordinance ("Registration Fee"). CCHAMPIONS shall 50% or \$100, whichever is greater, of each collected registration fee and remit the balance to the CITY in consideration of the services provided. CCHAMPIONS shall forward payment of the CITY's portion of the registration fee to the CITY's Finance Department no later than the 15th day of the following month during the term of this Agreement.
- D. CCHAMPIONS agrees to provide a website for the registration of each foreclosed property in order to enable compliance with the CITY's ordinances. The website will direct registrants to the CITY's website, and further direct traffic, via a hyperlink, to www.VacantRegistry.com. The website found at www.VacantRegistry.com will automatically allow lenders and/or responsible parties to comply with the CITY's Property Registration Codes.
- E. CCHAMPIONS, will execute the CITY's website Link agreement and meet all CITY IT security, and anti-viral requirements.
- F. CCHAMPIONS responsibilities will commence on the effective date of this agreement.

### 2. Indemnification:

- A. CCHAMPIONS shall indemnify and save harmless and defend the CITY, its trustees, elected and appointed officials, agents, servants and employees from and against any claim, demand or cause of action of whatsoever kind or nature arising out of error, omission, or negligent act of CCHAMPIONS, its agents, servants or employees in the performance of its obligations pursuant to this Agreement, for all costs, losses and expenses, including but not limited to, damages to persons or property, judgments, reasonable attorney's fees, paralegal expenses, and court costs at both the trial and appellate levels arising out of or in connection with the operations permitted under this Agreement.
- B. The parties recognize that various provisions of this Agreement, including but not necessarily limited to this Section, provide for indemnification by CCHAMPIONS and requires a specific consideration be given therefore. The parties therefore agree that the sum of Tcn Dollars and 00/100 (\$10.00), receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, is the specific consideration for such indemnities,

and the providing of such indemnities is deemed to be part of the specifications with respect to the services to be provided by CCHAMPIONS. Furthermore, the parties understand and agree that the covenants and representations relating to this indemnification provision shall serve the term of this Agreement and continue in full force and effect as to the party's responsibility to indemnify. CCHAMPIONS will indemnify and hold CITY harmless for any negligent acts of CCHAMPIONS or for any violation of any intellectual property laws, contracts or statutes.

- 3. EFFECTIVE DATE and TERM. The effective date of this Agreement is the date signed. This Agreement will terminate two (2) years from the effective date. In addition, the parties may agree to renew this Agreement for an additional (3) three- one (1) year term(s) through the execution of a written amendment to this Agreement signed by both parties.
- 4. TERMINATION. This Agreement may be terminated by either Party with or without cause, immediately upon thirty (30) calendar day's written notice. Upon termination by CITY, CCHAMPIONS shall cease all work performed and forward to CITY any Registration Fees owed to the CITY.
- 5. CONTRACT DOCUMENTS: The following list of documents which are attached hereto as exhibits to this Agreement shall be incorporated into this Agreement, as if fully set forth herein by reference:
- A, CITY Ordinance "2010-07," dated: July 13, 2010;
- 6. INSURANCE. CCHAMPIONS shall provide and maintain in force at all times during the Agreement with the CITY, such insurance, including Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance, Comprehensive General Liability Insurance, Automobile Liability Insurance and Errors and Omissions Insurance as will assure to Placentia the protection contained in the foregoing indemnification undertaken by CCHAMPIONS.
  - A. Workers' Compensation Statutory limits with \$100,000 Employers Liability.
  - B. Commercial General Liability Insurance with limits of no less than \$1,000,000.00. Bodily injury shall include operations and premises liability, products and completed operations, owners, and contractor's protective liability and personal injury liability.
  - C. Business Auto Liability coverage is to include bodily injury and property damage arising out of operation, maintenance or use of any auto, including

owned, non-owned and hired automobiles and employee non-ownership with limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence.

- D. Errors and Omissions Insurance limits of liability provided by such policy shall be no less than \$1,000,000.00 to assure CITY the indemnification specified herein.
- E. A Certificate of Insurance acceptable to the CITY shall be provided listing the above coverages and providing 30 days prior written notice to the CITY in the case of cancellation. The CITY shall be named as an additional insured and a certificate holder on the Commercial, General, Automobile, and Professional. Liability Policies with a waiver of subrogation on the Workers' Compensation Employer's Liability Policy. A copy of the certificate shall be mailed to the CITY's Risk Management Department at the time CCHAMPIONS executes this Agreement.
- 7. OWNERSHIP AND USE OF DOCUMENTS. All information collected by CCHAMPIONS from registering parties in connection with the registration of a property pursuant to this Agreement shall be the property of the CITY, and shall be provided to CITY upon request. CCHAMPIONS shall be permitted to retain copies, including reproducible copies, of drawings and specifications for information, reference and use in connection with CCHAMPIONS's endeavors.

### 8. AUDIT AND INSPECTION RIGIITS AND RETENTION OF RECORDS.

A. CITY shall have the right to audit the books, records and accounts of CCHAMPIONS that are related to this Agreement. CHAMPIONS shall keep, in digital or hard copy format, whichever format CCHAMPIONS so chooses, such book, records, and accounts as may be necessary in order to record complete and correct entries related to this Agreement. CCHAMPIONS shall preserve and make available, at reasonable times for examination and audit by the CITY, all financial records, supporting documents, statistical records, and any other documents pertinent to his Agreement for the required retention period of the Florida Public Records Act (Chapter 119, Florida Statutes), if applicable, or, if the Florida Public Records Act is not applicable, for a minimum period of three (3) years after termination of this Agreement, unless CCHAMPIONS is notified in writing by the CITY of the need to extend the retention period. Such retention of such records and documents shall be at CCHAMPIONS's expense. If an audit has been initiated and audit findings have not been resolved at the end of the retention period or three (3) years, whichever is longer, the books, records, and accounts shall be retained until resolution of the audit findings. If the Florida Public Records Act is determined by the CITY to be applicable to CCHAMPIONS's records, CCHAMPIONS shall comply with all requirements

thereof; however, no confidentiality or non-disclosure requirement of either federal or state law shall be violated by CCHAMPIONS.

B. In addition, for a period of 6 (six) months following the termination of this agreement, CCHAMPIONS shall respond to the reasonable inquiries of any successor companies and allow and successor companies to receive information in digital or hard copy format, whichever format CCHAMPIONS so chooses, relating to matters of continuing significance.

9. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR. This Agreement does not create an employee/employer relationship between the parties. It is the intent of the parties that CCHAMPIONS is an independent contractor under this Agreement and not the CITY's employee for all purposes, including but not limited to, the application of the Fair Labor Standards Act minimum wage and overtime payments, Federal Insurance Contribution Act, the Social Security Act, the Federal Unemployment Tax Act, the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code, the State Workers Compensation Act, and the State unemployment insurance law. CCHAMPIONS shall retain sole and absolute discretion in the judgment of the manner and means of carrying out CCHAMPIONS's activities and responsibilities hereunder. CCHAMPIONS agrees that it is a separate and independent enterprise from the CITY, that it has full opportunity to find other business, that it make its own investment in its business, and that it will utilize a high level of skill necessary to perform the work.

This Agreement shall not be construed as creating any joint employment relationship between CCHAMPIONS and the CITY and the CITY will not be liable for any obligation incurred by CCHAMPIONS, including but not limited to unpaid minimum wages and/or overtime premiums.

10. NOTICES. Whenever any party desires to give notice unto any other party, it must be given by written notice, sent by registered United States mail, with return receipt requested, hand delivery or facsimile transmission with receipt of delivery, addressed to the party for whom it is intended and the remaining party, at the places last specified, and the places for giving of notice shall remain such until they shall have been changed by written notice in compliance with the provisions of this section. Notice shall be deemed to have been given upon receipt. For the present, CCHAMPIONS and the CITY designate the following as the respective places for giving of notice:

- 11. ASSIGNMENT. For purposes of this Agreement, any change of ownership of CCHAMPIONS shall constitute an assignment which requires CCHAMPIONS to notify CITY in advance. This Agreement shall run to the CITY and its successors and assigns.
- 12. AMENDMENTS. It is further agreed that no modification, amendment or alteration in the terms or conditions contained herein shall be effective unless contained in a written document executed with the same formality and of equal dignity herewith.
- 13. BINDING AUTHORITY. Each person signing this Agreement on behalf of either party individually warrants that he or she has full legal power to execute this Agreement on behalf of the party for whom he or she is signing, and to bind and obligate such party with respect to all provisions contained in this Agreement.
- 14. LAWS AND ORDINANCES. CHAMPIONS shall observe all laws and ordinances of the CITY, county, state, federal or other public agencies directly relating to the operations being conducted pursuant to this Agreement.
- 15. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY. In the performance of this Agreement, CHAMPIONS shall not discriminate against any firm, employee or applicant for employment or any other firm or individual in providing services because of sex, age, race, color, religion, ancestry or national origin.
- 16. WAIVER. Any failure by CITY to require strict compliance with any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver of such provision, and CITY may subsequently require strict compliance at any time, notwithstanding any prior failure to do so.
- 17. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Agreement or application thereof to any person or situation shall to any extent, be held invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement, and the application of such provisions to persons or situations other than those as to which it shall have been held invalid or unenforceable shall not be affected thereby, and shall continue in full force and effect, and be enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.

- 18. GOVERNING LAW. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Florida with venue lying in Brevard County, Florida.
- 19. ATTORNEY'S FEES AND COSTS. In the event of a dispute arising out of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover reasonable attorney's fees, paralegal expenses, and costs, including fees and costs incurred at all pretrial, trial and appellate levels.
- 20. ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement represents the entire and integrated agreement between the CITY and the CCHAMPIONS and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, either written or oral.
