### 2015 Budget Review

S. Fitzgerald begins review of the 2015 proposed budgets. Recommendations for reductions:

Assessing Budget –S. Fitzgerald met with Marybeth Walker and discussed putting off the cost estimate for cycled and assessing services that we budgeted for 2015. Based on the Board's vote to adjust valuations by 5% this August, I recommend that we cut the Assessing budget by \$30,000, from \$110,000 to \$80,000.

Motion by J. Sherman to reduce the proposed 2015 Assessing Budget/Assessor's Contract/Line/1-4150-30-312 by \$30,000 for a new request of \$80,000 and a new bottom line of the Assessing Budget of \$146,047. as recommended in the Town Manager's report. 2<sup>nd</sup> by S. Ranlett. Vote 5-0-0 Motion carries

Personnel Budget- After review of the Town census with Greg Colby and Lori Sadewicz, looked at cost and roll up s in personnel budget I recommend reducing this budget by \$93255. We are looking at different strategies to reduce overall cost in the personnel budget.

- J Sherman asks what is included in this number
- S. Fitzgerald states there is retirement, soft costs and health care costs. He will provide a more detail list.
- J. Sherman makes a motion to reduce the proposed 2015 Personnel Budget by \$93,255 for a new bottom line of the proposed 2015 Personnel Budget of \$1,789,471. 2<sup>nd</sup> by S. Ranlett Vote 5-0-0 Motion carries.

Water Department- After meeting with Greg Colby and Water Superintendent, reviewing RSA's regarding utilities, the local governing body has the ability to expend money collected from water fees. I recommend reducing the Water Department budget by \$18,915, which was the additional money requested over the 2014 budget.

- J Sherman clarifies that the Board of Selectman has the authority to decide to use the water fees to offset expenses, it doesn't have to be a warrant article.
- S. Fitzgerald state that it is up to the Board to set methodology on how to charge for life cycle costs and utilities.

Discussion ensues.

J. Sherman makes a motion to reduce the proposed 2015 Water Department Budget by \$18,915 for a new bottom line of the proposed 2015 Water Department Budget of \$45,505 as recommended in the Town Manager's report. 2<sup>nd</sup> by S. Ranlett Vote 5-0-0 Motion carries.

With these changes the increase in the proposed increase to the budget drops from 5% to 3%. We are still looking for reductions to help present a conservative budget to the Town to keep tax rates level.

J Sherman requests a revised estimate on utility costs, gas, oil and mileage S Fitz states these will be available on Dec 15<sup>th</sup>.

Discussion ensues regarding changes the Town has made for energy efficiency.

- J. Sherman requests to bring the Fire Department Admin position for discussion whether it should be in the operating budget or separate warrant article.
- S. Fitzgerald states it should be a warrant article as new positions are presented in a warrant article. Suggests Chief McArdle to come to meeting and discuss next meeting.
- D. Poliquin requests to revisit the Health Department Budget- Deputy Health officer stipend.

He states it is a new line item this year, seems redundant with current situation.

#### Discussion ensues

- D. Poliquin asks if any more questions regarding the budget
- M. Curran asks about the Prosecutor's contract.
- S. Fitzgerald states we will continue to share the prosecutor as it is now.

Discussion ensues regarding the comparison of contract vs a sole prosecutor.

The Board requests additional information on resources for a comparison.
