## <u>APPROVAL OF JANUARY 5TH AT JANUARY 19TH, 2011 PLAISTOW FIRST</u> COMMITTEE MEETING(S) MINUTES

Leigh Komornick noted that she would have the meeting minutes of the last two meetings, and this meeting, to approve at the March 2, 2011 Plaistow First Committee meeting.

# PRESENTATION BY: RIP PATTEN, PE, LSP, LEED-AP, VP CREDERE ASSOCIATES, LLC, AND THERESA WALKER OF THE ROCKINGHAM PLANNING COMMISSION REGARDING BROWNFIELDS PROGRAM

The meeting focused on a presentation by Theresa Walker of the Rockingham Planning Commission, and Rip Patten of Credere Associates, LLC, on the Brownfields Program and how it could be utilized by Plaistow to facilitate community and economic development, especially Town-owned lands. The intent of the program is to evaluate in-fill development sites that may not make business sense to evaluate on our own. Grant funding is available to the Public, Non-Profit & For-Profit entities. There is no funding match required.

The RPC has \$400,000 for the assessment of both petroleum and hazardous substance sites. Plaistow has had a number of sites identified in their preliminary "windshield" survey

done a few years ago, but it would require further coordination with the property owners to assess their interest in pursuing this program. One site they are particularly interested in is the Chart site on Main Street.

In addition to the Brownfields Program, the Plaistow First Committee also discussed the "Plan NH Design Charrette Program" and how their current application for funding is due March 17, 2011.

Plan NH is currently seeking applications from NH municipalities who are interested in holding a design charrette in the coming year. Applications are due by March 17, 2011, and upon discussions with Theresa Walker of the Rockingham Planning Commission, they are going to provide assistance to Plaistow in applying for a charrette.


A design charrette is a graphic equivalent of a brainstorming session in which professionals from different disciplines within the building industry come together to address a design challenge, usually around a town center or significant neighborhood. There might be a traffic issue, or a need for gathering space. Sometimes a town has an historic building it wants to tie in with the surroundings. Sometimes a town just needs a fresh look from neutral parties to figure out how to make the area more appealing, or more of a town center.

The charrettes are conducted by volunteers from Plan NH membership and others appropriate to the project - architects, traffic engineers, landscape architects, real estate professionals, planners, contractors, and so forth. Listening sessions are held on a Friday afternoon and evening, and Saturday morning to early afternoon.

Plaistow's "Design Challenge" that we will be requesting is the "Village Center District" which runs from the Library to Maple Avenue as displayed below. This will allow the citizens of Plaistow to become engaged with other citizens, their Town Officials, business and industry leaders, and to participate in the creation of a vision for Plaistow.

★ At the end of the discussion, George Melvin motioned that application be made for the Design Charrette for the Village Center District and surrounding properties. Dave Hansbury seconded.
