LETTER OF ENGAGEMENT

PORT CHESTER PROPERTY CONDITION ASSESSMENT AND NEIGHBORHOOD REVITALIZATION STRATEGIES REPORT

May 1, 2015

As the Managing Principal of Kevin Dwarka LLC, I am delighted to submit this letter of engagement for the **Port Chester Property Condition Assessment and Neighborhood Revitalization Strategies Report** to the Village of Port Chester. This letter presents my firm's work plan and budget for a seven month multi-disciplinary planning process. The letter is in response to a formal RFP process initiated by the Village of Port Chester in May 2014.

Divided into five concrete tasks, the engagement is budgeted at \$75,000. All project deliverables will be completed by November 30th, 2015. This letter, including all the contract terms outlined below, constitutes a fixed and binding offer and is effective for 30 days.

Contract Terms

Under this letter of engagement, Kevin Dwarka LLC ("KDLLC") agrees to provide the Village of Port Chester ("VPC") with five deliverables comprising the Port Chester Property Condition Assessment and Neighborhood Revitalization Strategies Report ("PCANRS") as outlined in the above Detailed Work Plan ("DWP") and in accordance with the following terms and conditions:

Duration of Service

- KDLLC will commence work on the project on May 8st, 2015. Final versions of all five deliverables will be submitted to the VPC no later than November 30th, 2015.
- Draft deliverables will be prepared in accordance with the deadlines presented in the DWP.
- KDLLC does not commit to providing any services beyond November 30th, 2015. If the DWP is not completed by November 30th due to unforeseen delays, a new contract will need to be negotiated.

Scope of Services

■ KDLLC agrees to furnish the VPC with land use guidance and economic analysis. Although Kevin Dwarka is a land use attorney licensed in the State of New York, this project does *not* include the provision of legal services. VPC is advised to retain independent legal representation throughout the duration of the contract period. However, in its capacity as an urban planning firm, KDLLC will carefully inventory the relevant laws, rules and regulations regarding urban redevelopment as part of its initial existing conditions assessment. Additionally, KDLLC will carefully assess the viability of all redevelopment proposals with particular regard to any legal or regulatory obstacles potentially affecting their implementation. The final document will feature a variety of viable neighborhood revitalization strategies such as property rehabilitation programs, infill development potential, brownfield redevelopment, selective demolition, condemnation/urban renewal as well as potential legal processes and funding sources for each.

Public Involvement and On-Site Presence

KDLCC agrees to be present as needed for on-site meetings with the project team, other key public
agency stakeholders, and the public-at-large. The cost of attending these meetings is absorbed into
the overall budget as presented in the DWP.

Budget and Payment

- The total cost for the completion of the PCANRS is \$75,000.
- A retainer is not required for this engagement.
- Over the contract period, KDLLC will issue a total of five invoices with the submission of each draft deliverable.
- PCANRS agrees to remit payment for each invoice within a 30 day period.
- Failure to make payment within the 30 day period will result in a 5% late payment charge applied to the outstanding principal at the end of 30 days and at the end of each subsequent 30 day period in which payment is not made. Failure to make payment within 60 days of receipt of invoice will result in KDLLC's suspension of work on the project. Failure to make payment of an invoice within 90 days will result in KDLLC's termination of the project and notification of the outstanding payment to a third party collection agency.
- The budget of \$75,000 is all-inclusive. VPC will not be billed for any additional expenses including materials, travel expenses, food and beverage, production costs, or any additional vendor or subconsultant fees.
- VPC is guaranteed timely completion of all deliverables in accordance with the tasks outlined in the DWP regardless of the hours required for their completion.

All deliverables will be submitted to the VPC in both WORD and PDF formats.

Town of Rye Assessment Department Service Level

Is It "Adequate?

Is It "Real"?

Overview:

Recently the Village of Port Chester (VPC) claimed that the ~25% reduction of assessed values in the village from 2008 to 2014 is a result of inadequate staffing in the assessment department.

The Town's rebuttal to this inference is:

- Current assessment department staffing is consistent with the International Association of Assessing
 Officer (IAAO) guidelines
- VPC's annual assessment trends are consistent with the other villages within Rye Town, as well as with other municipalities within the county
- The village's assessments are consistent with market trends and sales data
- The significant decrease in the village's assessment is directly related to the loss in value of the disproportionate number of 2-3 families (39%) with in the village
- The 2014 assessment roll (based on 2013 sales) increased overall ~.7% from the 2013 assessment roll due to market conditions

VPC CHALLENGES TOR ASSESSMENT SERVICE

VPC Village Manager – in a presentation in the context of Town Dissolution - questioned whether TOR's assessment service level is "real" – later characterizing it as at "best artificial or perhaps contrived"

VM Steers and other member of the VPC Board seem to believe that TOR's assessment services have led to a decline in VPC's assessed values and therefore its real estate tax revenue:

VPC concluded that until an independent evaluation of TOR's assessment services is conducted, it is not certain whether TOR's assessment department is the cause of a 25.3% decline in the assessed values in VPC since 2008.

IAAO GUIDELINES

Rather than citing IAAO (International Association of Assessing Officials) guidelines, VM Steers cited a devastating 2007 critique of TOR's assessment department from the previous administration - now 8 years out of date.

Official IAAO Guidance is Clear: Staffing Patterns and the Effect of Computerization Although one full-time employee for every 2,500 parcels is typical, this proportion varies greatly among jurisdictions. In smaller jurisdictions, the workload averages 1,500 to 1,700 parcels per employee; in larger jurisdictions, about 3,000 to 3,500. Workloads vary depending on the quality of the staff, the complexity of the properties, and so on. A 1986 survey by IAAO has shown that the average number of parcels per employee without computer assistance decreases the mean number of parcels per employee.

(From IAAO Handbook – Standard on Mass Appraisal of Real Property approved 2013)

TOR ASSESSMENT SERVICES

TOR's assessment services are well within IAAO Guidelines:

- 11,091 parcels divided by 4.5 (# of TOR's assessment employees) = 2,465 parcels per employee (IAAO guideline is 2,500 parcels)
- In addition, TOR has worked very hard to supplement its staff with 3rd party vendors using cutting edge technology such as Vision Appraisal, GAR Associates, Inc. (Real Estate Appraisers and Consultants), and IncomeWorks.

ARE VPC ASSESSMENTS DOWN BECAUSE OF MARKET CONDITIONS OR INADEQUATE ASSESSMENT SERVICE FROM TOR?

Assessments from 2008-14 for...

All municipalities in Westchester County - 17.33%

All villages in TOR... - 19.16%

- VRB - 12.91%

- VOM (Rye Neck) - 17.62%

- VPC - 25.83%

TOR's assessed values for VPC are consistent with what the rest of the municipalities throughout Westchester County are experiencing, as well as within Rye Town.

OTHER FACTORS THAT EXPLAIN WHY VPC'S ASSESSED VALUES FELL MORE THAN ITS NEIGHBORS?

- VPC is at full value; therefore, VPC assessed values follow market trends more closely than "non-reval" communities throughout the county. Residential properties are **directly impacted** by change in residential sales prices.
- Commercial (non-homestead) properties were down only 8%.
 - Only 20% of those parcels are non-homestead.
- Residential (homestead) properties were down 30.7%.
 - This residential drop represented 89% of the overall decline.
 - There are 5,451 parcels in VPC, of which 80% are homestead.

IMPACT OF 2- & 3-FAMILY RESIDENCES

- The VPC homestead class that accounted for ~ 89% of the decline in assessed values, was further exacerbated by the disproportionately high % of 2-3 family homes.
- 39% of the homestead class is 2- and 3-family properties that from 2008 to 2012 - have experienced a greater loss in value than single families.



The Traffic Commission in preparing to repaint the fire zone in front of Fire Headquarters which was approved by the Board and upper management and in regarding Fire Chief Quinn's complaint, checked the Village Code to find this problem within the code. Please review the code as it states at this time, see attachment #1. As you can see it was this section of the Code covering Fire Headquarters that was deleted in 2010 creating a problem for exiting and returning fire equipment, see attachment #2. Enclosed is a copy of the V&T Law which states that the fire zone must exist for safety issues, see attachment #3. The Traffic Commission is making the recommendation for you to upgrade the Code of the Village of Port Chester, Vehicles and Traffic, Chapter 319-74 (Schedule XIII) "No Parking or Standing at any time".

South End Fire Station, both sides of Grace Church Street between Central Avenue and Don Bosco Place.

Willett Avenue Firehouse, east side of Willett Avenue: fire zone going south 124 feet from the north corner of Mortimer Street; west side of Willett Avenue: fire zone going south 90 feet from the south corner of Mortimer Street.

- It is directed that said zones be maintained and kept open at all times for the movement of emergency vehicles and other traffic. The width of each zone shall be measured along the curb line, if established or existing. If no curbline exists, then the fire zone shall be measured along the shoulder of the roadway fronting the fire station property.
- B. No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or pedestrians or in compliance with the directions of a police officer in any of said fire zones.
- C. The Village of Port Chester's Police Department is authorized and directed to remove any vehicle parked, abandoned or found unattended in any fire zone as described in this section where it constitutes an obstruction to traffic or any place where stopping, standing or parking is prohibited under this section.
- D. The violation of this section, adopted pursuant to §§ 1640 and 1640-a of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York shall constitute a traffic infraction within the meaning of § 1800 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.

ATTATCHMENT #1

Every person convicted of a traffic infraction for a violation of any of the above provisions of this section, adopted pursuant to §§ 1640 and 1640-a of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York, shall for the first conviction thereof be punishable by a fine of \$50 and for a second or a subsequent conviction shall be punishable by a fine of \$100. These fines may be recovered by the Village of Port Chester in a civil action.

STOPPING, STANDING, AND PARKING

Common Traffic Law Violations for Article 32

- 1200. Basic rules.
- 1201. Stopping, standing, or parking outside of business or residence districts.
- **1202.** Stopping, standing, or parking prohibited in specified places.
- **1203**. Additional parking regulations.
- 1203-a. Parking permits for handicapped persons.
- 1203-b. Parking spaces; handicapped.
- **1203-c.** Off street parking spaces for the handicapped.
- 1203-d. Out-of-state vehicles bearing handicapped identification.
- 1203-e. Dumping snow onto parking places for handicapped prohibited.
- **1203-f.** Handicapped parking enforcement.
- **1203-g.** Establishment of the handicapped parking education program.
- 1203-h. Metered parking waiver for certain disabilities.
- 1204. Officers authorized to remove illegally stopped vehicles.
- S 1200. Basic rules. (a) When stopping is prohibited by this article, or by local law, ordinance, order, rule or regulation, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or traffic-control sign or signal.
 - (b) When standing is prohibted by this article, or by local law, ordinance, order, rule or regulation, no person shall stand or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, but may stop temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in receiving or discharging passengers.
 - (c) When parking is prohibited by this article, or by local law, ordinance, order, rule or regulation, no person shall park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, but may stop or stand temporarily for the

purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading merchandise or passengers.

- (d) When official signs have been posted prohibiting, restricting or limiting the stopping, standing or parking of vehicles on any highway, no person shall stop, stand or park any vehicle in violation of the restrictions stated on such signs.
- S 1201. Stopping, standing, or parking outside of business or residence districts. (a) Upon any highway outside of a business or residence district no person shall stop, park, or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, upon the paved or main-traveled part of the highway when it is practicable to stop, park, or so leave such vehicle off such part of said highway, but in every event an unobstructed width of the highway opposite a standing vehicle shall be left for the free passage of other vehicles and a clear view of such stopped vehicles shall be available from a distance of two hundred feet in each direction upon such highway.
 - (b) This section shall not apply to the driver of any vehicle which is disabled while on the paved or main-traveled portion of a highway in such manner and to such extent that it is impossible to avoid stopping and temporarily leaving such disabled vehicle in such position.
- S 1202. Stopping, standing or parking prohibited in specified places.
 - (a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic, or when in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official

traffic-control device, no person shall:

- 1. Stop, stand or park a vehicle:
- a. On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped, standing or parked at the edge or curb of a street;
 - b. On a sidewalk;
- c. Within an intersection, except when permitted by official signs or parking meters on the side of a highway opposite a street which intersects but does not cross such highway;
- d. On a cross walk:
- e. Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within thirty feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless a different distance is indicated by official signs, markings or parking meters;
- f. Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when stopping, standing or parking would obstruct traffic;
- g. Upon any bridge or other elevated structure upon a highway or within a highway tunnel, unless otherwise indicated by official signs, markings or parking meters;
 - h. On any railroad tracks;
- i. In the area between roadways of a divided highway, including crossovers, except in an emergency;
- j. On a state expressway highway or state interstate route highway, including the entrances thereto and exits therefrom, which are a part thereof, except in an emergency.
- k. Engage in the retail sale of frozen desserts as that term is

defined in subdivision thirty-seven of section three hundred seventy-five of this chapter directly to pedestrians on any highway having a speed limit in excess of thirty miles per hour. Nothing herein shall be construed to prohibit the operator of such vehicle from stopping such vehicle off such highway, in a safe manner, for the sole purpose of delivering such retail product directly to the residence of a consumer or to the business address of a customer of such retailer.

- 2. Stand or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except momentarily to pick up or discharge a passenger or passengers:
- a. In front of a public or private driveway;
- b. Within twenty feet of a cross walk at an intersection, unless a different distance is indicated by official signs, markings or parking meters;
- c. Within thirty feet upon the approach to any flashing signal, stop or yield sign or traffic-control signal located at the side of the roadway, unless a different distance is indicated by official signs, markings or parking meters;
- d. Within twenty feet of the driveway entrance to any fire station and, when on the side of the street opposite to the entrance of any fire station, within seventy-five feet of said entrance, when properly signposted, unless a different distance is indicated by official signs, markings or parking meters.
- e. Alongside or obstructing a curb area which has been cut down, lowered or constructed so as to provide accessibility to the sidewalk.
- 3. Park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except temporarily for the

purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading merchandise or passengers, within fifty feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing, unless a different distance is indicated by official signs, markings or parking meters.

- (b) No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle within fifteen feet of a fire hydrant except when such vehicle is attended by a licensed operator or chauffeur who is seated in the front seat and who can immediately move such vehicle in case of emergency, unless a different distance is indicated by official signs, markings or parking meters.
- (c) No person shall move a vehicle not lawfully under his control into any prohibited area or away from a curb such distance as is unlawful.
