

# Board of Registrars

## August 23, 2016 Minutes

Attendees: Claire Golding, Rosemary Fudeman, Anne Littlefield, Lynne Grettum

- Meeting was convened at 9:12AM
- Unanimously approved minutes of April 23, 2016 meeting as written.
- Board reviewed the fall election schedule which includes
  - State Election Sept. 8<sup>th</sup>
  - Special Town Election Sept. 22<sup>nd</sup>
  - Presidential Election 11/8
- The last day to register for the State Primary was August 19<sup>th</sup>. There was a special registration held on August 19<sup>th</sup> from 8am to 8pm at the Town Clerk's Office
- Last day to register for the Special Town Election is Sept. 8<sup>th</sup>, and the last day to register for the Presidential Election is October 19<sup>th</sup>. On both days a special registration session would be held from 8am to 8pm at the Town Clerk's Office
- Early voting update
  - Lynne reviewed the training documentation from the Elections Division and sent the required note to Elections that affirmed the training documentation was reviewed and understood.
  - A discussion of the early voting schedule resulted in a unanimous decision to open only during the Town Clerk's normal business hours. That is the minimum hours required by law. No extra hours or Saturday voting would be scheduled. Board felt that since this was the first election where early voting was being offered that we should proceed slowly and perhaps offer more hours the next time.
- Lynne updated the board members about pre-registration of 16 and 17 year olds. Princeton did receive 5 pre-registrations. Those will stay in the voter system queue until the resident turns 18. At that time the resident will be notified that they are eligible to vote.
- Voter Project – Board agreed on a plan to send letters out to residents turning 18 in time for the Presidential Election. Letters would be mailed September 26<sup>th</sup>.
