In moving through Article 3 the question was divided. There were three budget items held out for discussion. 1. Health Insurance, 2. Bentley Purchase, and 3. Wachusett Regional School.

There were questions from voters on the Expense line item of both the Police and Fire Dept. Police Chief Schmohl explained that the budget was for dispatch, and there were increases for power, heating oil, gasoline and diesel. Fire Chief Laporte also described the increases in fuel and energy costs for his department as well.

A vote was taken on the larger portion of the budget minus the three HELD items.

Discussion of HELD items:

Wachusett Regional School Operations Assessment – An explanation was requested for the reduction in the budget number from \$542,683 to \$464,578. Selectman Joseph O'Brien explained that since the Warrant was printed the school reduced the total assessment by \$1 million, and the decrease is Princeton's share of that reduction.

Bentley Interest – An explanation was requested for the reduction in the revised budget number from \$52,500 to \$49,374. Selectman Joseph O'Brien explained that the original number was an estimate used when the Warrant went to print, and that the town had subsequently negotiated a lower interest rate.

Health Insurance – Selectman Alan Sentkowski explained that the reduction from the original budget number of \$303,000 to \$285,000 was due to plan design changes that produced lower rate increases.

The Moderator put forth the three HELD items as a package for a vote.

A brief presentation was made by Arthur Allen of 13 Town Farm Rd. who is on the Wachusett Earth Day Board of Directors and Princeton's representative on the site development team for the Earth Day Regional Collection Center. Mr. Allen made the following points:

- 1 day Earth Day Collections were held twice yearly from 1993-2006
- Collections ceased in 2006 to plan for the regional center
- DCR has donated 6 acres of land on Raymond Huntington Dr. which is a bypass situated between Rt. 140 in Sterling and Laurel St. in W. Boylston for the site
- State grants and contributions in the amount of \$117K have been received to cover a portion of the Phase 1 \$337K cost
- Phase 1 includes surveying and land preparing
- Anticipate an early opening in Fall of 2008, but must be open by June 2009
- Items collected would be Household hazardous waste, all items not included in pickup by trash haulers

He also said that not approving the article would force the school district to cover the cost out of the operating budget.
