Article 4: Voted to authorize the Conservation Commission to enter into a lease agreement for 26.2 +/- acres of hayfields located at the intersection of Gates and Old Colony Roads, shown on a plan of land prepared by David E. Ross Associates, entitled "Plan of Land in Princeton, Massachusetts, prepared for the Trust for Public Land", any such lease to be used for conservation, agriculture and/or passive recreation purposes, not to exceed 10 years, provided that any such lease agreement is consistent with Chapter

132A, Section 11 of the General Laws and the land use and site management plan for this property

Discussion:

Selectman Joseph O'Brien opened the discussion with a brief statement to explain the purpose of the article. Mr. O'Brien stated that it was always the intention once the Bentley property was owned by the town to keep the land in agricultural use. This article allows the town to enter into a long term lease so that it can be done on a good agricultural plan and comply with the self help grant.

The Moderator requested Town Counsel opinion of whether a 2/3 vote was needed; Town Counsel stated that the vote needed to be 2/3.

A voter requested the status of the Bentley purchase. Selectman O'Brien state that the property is still in process pending the passage of this article. There were questions as to whether the change in the closing date had an impact on the sale. Town Counsel stated that any discussion of the original deal for the Bentley purchase was outside the agenda of the current Town Meeting.

Scott Mellecker proposed an amendment (Amendment 1), which was seconded, to drop the words [agriculture /or] leaving the article to read..."such lease to be used for conservation and recreation purposes..."

Mr. Mellecker in making this amendment felt that it represented the wording found in the original amendment passed at the October 30, 2007 town meeting.

David Krashes proposed an amendment (Amendment 2) to Amendment 1, which was seconded, to insert the words "with haying allowed" leaving the article to read …"passive recreation purposes with haying allowed…"

Mr. Krashes' stated his intention in making this amendment was to ensure that having would always be allowed.

After some discussion on Amendment 2 a motion was made and seconded to move Amendment 2 to a vote.
