Front Step Lighting Repair

Pam Southworth reported \$2,720.18 was submitted to the Town for capital reimbursement for the lighting repair. Teresa Roxburgh reported Tom Kowalski is preparing an estimate to put the parking lot and stair lights on a motion sensor. Some of the lights would need to be converted to LED.

Vote on AV Committee Recommendation

The Board reviewed the recommendation from the AV Committee regarding noise mitigation in the Community Studio. **Motion:** To approve the revised working agreement with Tom Gribbon leading to the development of two installation proposals for Fellert Acoustic Material that the Board will review in the future. STRATEGIC DISCUSSION

2017 Endowment Performance

C. Newby/Joe Pucci, Bernstein

Joe Pucci distributed the Bernstein presentation booklet for the Hodge/Minor Library to all members. He reviewed the investments and stated the endowment did very well over the past year. He spoke of the endowments growth in 2017 as something you would typically see over a three-year period. Mr. Pucci stated to expect continued growth in 2018, but not at the 2017 rate. Mr. Pucci made recommendations to diversify the portfolio and suggested moving some funds into Sustainable Growth. There was a discussion about the current state of the market and when would be a good time to withdraw some funds. The Board thanked Mr. Pucci for coming in to speak with them.

Board of Finance Budget Review

Pam Southworth reported that she, Cynthia Newby, and Teresa Roxburgh met with the Board of Finance on February 20, 2018 and gave an overview of the meeting. She recommended the Library look at their equipment needs, and money could be escrowed toward it. There was a discussion about putting a committee together to formulate an equipment list or hiring the HVAC person to do the list. It was decided Pam Southworth will organize this and report back to the Board.

OTHER BUSINESS

Plans for 25th Anniversary Art Show

Joan Stracks reported a committee was formed to plan the 25th Anniversary Art Show which will start in June 2019. The committee will be meeting next week.

Consideration of I. B. Mills Family Request to Donate a Sculpture

And to Use Community Studio for Memorial Service

Director Roxburgh reported longtime resident Inga-Britta Mills passed away. Her family has requested use of the Community Studio to hold a memorial service. The Board approved this request. Director Roxburgh further reported the family would like to donate a steel sculpture named "Soar" by Jim Travers to the library campus in her memory. Pictures of the sculpture were circulated amongst the Board members. There was a discussion about the proposed donation. Since not all Board members were in attendance, it was decided to continue this discussion at the next meeting.

Consideration of Electrical Vehicle Charging Station

T. Roxburgh

Director Roxburgh reported she was contacted by First Selectman Barbara Henry and asked if the Library would consider installing an Electric Vehicle Charging Station in the back of the parking lot. This would be at no cost to the Library for installation and future charges. The Board members requested a picture of it before they decide. They also asked if the Town would be receptive to plowing the Library parking lot, so the charging station would be available for use in inclement weather. Director Roxburgh will report back to the Board.

Contemplation Garden Update

C. Newby

Chairwoman Newby reported some of the gravel areas in the Contemplation Garden need to be repaired. She also reported the current brass signage is tarnished, unreadable, and difficult to clean. She stated it might be time to look into new weather resistant signage. Jeff Bennett offered to look into cleaning and sealing the brass. He will report back to the Board.
