## V. City Council Action

- 3. Approval of Outdoor Grilling/Fundraising Bryan Park: Jed Casburn has discussed with the Odd Fellows the possible interest in leading grilling activities in Bryan Park, near the Men's Softball Field, as a fundraising activity for both the Odd Fellows and for Salem Recreation. Thus far, the Odd Fellows have expressed interest in grilling every evening that men's softball games are held, which would be Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Certain details may not be ironed out by Council-time Monday, such as percentage split of dollars earned and whether other clubs would be given access to Bryan Park for grilling/fundraising (open access to Park should be maintained for other clubs if interested). At first, at least, I'd like to get Council approval for fundraising activities in Bryan Park as they have been loosely described and to allow details to be worked out in the future.
- 4. Approval of Requests for TIF Assistance: We've been receiving unsolicited inquiries and proposals for Downtown TIF-supported projects. Safely, the City has/will have approximately \$200,000 in Downtown TIF dollars available for projects (see chart from FY18 budget worksheet below). Not included on that chart yet are parking lot improvements in the area of the demolished 110 S Walnut. A Rhutasel estmate for that work is in your packet, for which I've asked about phasing identified work. On a matter separate from new projects, we've had \$35,000 committed for the Theater Building to match a capital project for restroom/dressing room expansion. It appears those dollars from the State will not be made available. Does the City still want to commit \$35,000 for the Theater Building from TIF?

**5.** <u>Approval of FY17 Budget Amendment:</u> Please see the enclosed budget amendment with some notes below. I request approval of the budget amendment.

<u>Item</u>	<u>Amount</u>	<u>Note</u>
Dump Truck	\$74,200	Approved for FY16, not paid until FY17.
Police Squad	\$20,000	We don't do the interfund loan for the squad car due to cash and budget mgmt. goals.

- **6.** <u>Second Reading Approval of FY18 Budget:</u> The FY18 budget would total \$17,577,865. This is \$3,400 higher than presented on first reading, which is due to additional dollars that might have been under-projected to be received from the property tax for the Library. The budget is ready to be approved by the City, which I recommend it do.
- 7. Approval of IDOT Resolution: I recommend adoption of the attached IDOT resolution authorizing FAU and City dollars to be allocated to replacement of Illinois Street sidewalk. The resolution estimates project costs and allocations high in order to capture any potential cost overruns in the project and so we don't have to adopt a revised resolution. Maximum help from IDOT will be \$160,000, and we've budgeted \$40,000 in the FY18 MFT budget to cover what we expect City costs to be.
- **8.** Purchase Approval for Gas System Improvements: I reported to the Council previously that we wanted to seek bids for FY18 gas system improvements on Illinois Street. Bids have been received and a memo is being prepared to tabulate them for presentation. I understand a low bid will be recommended.
