Councillor Ryan asked cost to charge a car, if only electric vehicles can park there and how ~~suspense~~ durable are they.


Councillor Carr asked about maintenance costs due to vandalism and what sort of maintenance contract would be required.

Electric Vehicle Charging Station Grant Program

Fact Sheet

Grant award

- Actual charging stations for eight electric vehicles
- An installation subsidy of \$1,000 for each duplex charging station, for a total of \$4,000.

Granting agency

MA Department of Energy Resources - Green Communities Division

Project scope

- The charging stations will be provided directly to the City of Salem by the vendor, AeroVironment at no cost.
- They will be wall-mounted in both municipal garages; four charging stations in each garage.
- The total installation cost is \$14,058. However, the State is providing a subsidy of \$4,000; City will only pay \$10,058.
- Selected installation vendor is Voltrek, LLC, Andover, MA
- The request for an additional \$2,000 is for electrical upgrades to Museum Place Garage

Local objectives

- To provide a service to Salem residents who own an electric vehicle.
- To promote Salem as a green tourist destination.
- To position Salem as a leader among designated Green Communities.
- To support state objectives in developing electric vehicle market.

State objectives

- To encourage the use of electric vehicles by increasing the number of electric vehicle charging stations that are available to the public
- To reduce vehicular emissions
- To accelerate the market for electric vehicles
