#### DIVISION 10. COMMISSION ON DISABILITIES

#### Sec. 2-926. Established, composition and compensation.

There is established the commission on disabilities. The commission shall consist of nine members, and the members shall serve without compensation.

(Code 1973, § 2-616; Ord. of 6-28-2007, § 1)

#### Sec. 2-927. Appointment and terms of members; filling vacancies.

The seven members of the commission on disabilities shall be appointed by the mayor, subject to confirmation by the city council, and shall hold office for three-year terms. Each member shall serve until a successor is duly appointed and confirmed. Any vacancy which shall occur in the commission shall be filled in accordance with this section.

(Code 1973, § 2-617)

#### Sec. 2-928. Duties generally.

The commission on disabilities shall act in an advisory and consultative capacity with the general objectives of coordinating with the city departments and interested organizations the concerns of the handicapped and may promote, assist and coordinate all activities designated to meet such concerns at community levels. (Code 1973, § 2-618)

#### DIVISION 11. SCHOOL COMMITTEE

### Sec. 2-956. Compensation of members.

Effective July 1, 1989, the members of the school committee, with the exception of the mayor, shall receive the sum of \$2,500.00 for expenses per fiscal year for their services. The sum shall be paid in one lump sum the first week in December following the expiration of the prior fiscal year. (Code 1973, § 2-136)

#### DIVISION 12. TRANSPORTATION ADVISORY COMMISSION\*

#### Sec. 2-986. Created; composition; appointment and terms.

- (a) The transportation advisory commission is created. The commission shall consist of the following five members who shall reside in the city:
  - Two members from the retail business community;
  - One member from the general commu-**(2)**
  - One member from the planning department: and
  - One member from the private area of transportation.
- (b) All members are to be appointed by the mayor and subject to city council confirmation. The appointments to the commission shall be for staggered terms of three years. (Code 1973, § 2-700)

#### Sec. 2-987. Duties.

- (a) The transportation advisory commission shall advise on all areas of private transportation and shall perform all duties required in conformance with this Code. In addition, the commission shall advise the mayor and city council relative to all matters relating to transportation in the city.
- (b) The transportation advisory commission shall work as liaison to private transportation companies and individuals to coordinate a service of transportation for the general public. It shall initiate advertising and promotional programs for the general use of transportation. It shall work with the Chamber of Commerce, city agencies and general business and other interested groups in organizing transportation. (Code 1973, § 2-701)

"Pursuant to Chapter 71, Section 52 of the General Laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, members of the Salem School Committee shall be compensated at a rate equal to 2/3 the compensation provided to members of the Salem City Council as specified in Division 3, Section 2-271 of the Code of Ordinances, effective in calendar year 2011. School Committee members shall receive no other stipend for their services"

## INFORMATIONAL NOTE---- CH 71, Sec 52 of MA General Laws

Section 52. The school committee shall serve without compensation, except that a member of a school committee of a city, town, regional school district or superintendency union may be compensated for his services by a majority vote of the city council in a city having a Plan D or Plan E charter; in a city not having a Plan D or Plan E charter by vote of the city council, subject to the provisions of the charter of such a city; in a town by a majority vote at a town meeting; and in a regional school district or school superintendency by a majority vote of the voting member towns authorized at their respective town meetings, the amount of such compensation, in each case, to be set by the respective cities, towns or groups of towns. No member of a school committee in any town shall be eligible to the position of teacher, or superintendent of public schools therein, or in any union school or superintendency union or district in which his town participates.

#### **Under \$5000 Rule for Retirement Creditable Service**

Effective July 1, 2009, M.G.L. c. 32 s.4(1)(o) now provides that "the service of a state, county or municipal employee employed or elected in a position receiving compensation of less than \$5,000 annually, which service occurs on or after July 1, 2009, shall not constitute creditable service for purposes of this chapter."

#### **Eligibility for Health Insurance**

G.L. c. 32B, § 2( d ), as amended through St.1958, c. 536, defines "employees" covered by municipal group insurance policies, reads as follows: "(d) 'Employee,' any person in the service of a governmental unit ... who receives compensation for such service or services, whether such person be employed, appointed or elected by popular vote ... provided, the duties of such person require no less than twenty hours, regularly, in the service of the governmental unit during the regular work week of permanent or temporary employment ... except that persons elected by popular vote may be considered eligible employees during the entire term for which they are elected regardless of the number of hours devoted to the service of the governmental unit .... A determination by the appropriate public authority that a person is eligible for participation in the plan of insurance shall be final." (Emphasis added.)
