John is a husband, a father, and a teacher as well as a marathon runner who maintains dual citizenship. He's been relentless in his training regimen as he hopes to run this year's Boston Marathon. He shared his mantra '#be the hammer' after being in Boston two years ago and again last year when he was hit by illness and became unable to complete. We'll all be supporting John in this year's run to the finish.

Chrissy Kenney shared about the Walk for HAWC coming up on Sunday, April 26th. The walk will begin at noon, but registration starts at 9am. Sign up via the internet is fast and easy, everyone is encouraged to walk –individually or with some friends as a team! If you're unable to walk there are volunteer opportunities as well! It's a 3 mile walk that begins and ends at the Salem Common.

This year's goal is to raise over \$100,000 to support their programs. Every dollar raised goes to the men, women and children served by HAWC. Services are provided to victims of domestic abuse but programs are also provided to change patterns of aggression to end abuse. There is also a social justice component offered at HAWC.
