Monthly School Board Update

- Donna Greene, School Board member stated that the School Deliberative session with be held on Thursday, February 4th at 7pm at the PAC.
- Donna stated that last week there was a budget public hearing and the school budget this
- year is \$69.3 million, which is a 9.3% increase over what was expended last year. She said
- this amount does not include the teacher's contract, which is \$1.9 million over 3 years.
- Donna also stated that the total amount expended by June 30, 2015 divided by the number
- of students being educated the total cost per student was \$16,962.00 and if the total
- amount of the 2016/17 budget is expended the total cost per student would be \$19,652.00,
- again this does not the teacher's contract.
- Donna said there will be discussion at the next School Board meeting in regards to the 2
- pending bills before the House Committees. House B1303, which is intended to clarify the
- 67 requirements for a town to withdraw from a cooperative school district and House B1201
- or 2 which is a proposed changed in the withdrawal legislation to require only a vote of the
- 69 withdrawing district and not the entire school district.
- 70 Donna updated the BOS with NH Supreme Ct case between herself and the school district,
- 71 which was heard early January. She was it was an extremely interesting 30 minutes of
- debate. Donna also refers to the case in Hampstead in regards to the Chairman of the
- 73 Budget Committee stating things he shouldn't have and since regret. Donna feels that he
- 74 was in no harm to the students but because of his statements he was asked to resign by the
- 75 superintendent. She said she tried to call a meeting with School Board to discuss this and
- 76 the Chairman of the School Board would have no part of it. Then she said she contacted all
- of the SAU Board Members individually and again she got no response. She is concerned
- 78 and feels this is an abuse of authority on the superintendent's part as there were no threats
- made against any children. She wants the residents of Sandown to know that she has a

great concern in regards to this situation and has done her best to address it at the SAU level.

- 98 Selectman Goldman asked as they go through Articles 13 & 14 will there be public
- comment and Selectman Devine said no, they BOS will just be approving or not approving them.

 Petition Warrant Article 13 Withdrawal from the TRSD
- Lynne said the BOS need to put their recommendation on this article and stated the Budget
- 103 Committee decided not to vote on a recommendation on this article as it is stated in the
- article that there is no tax impact.
- Motion by Selectman Tombarello that the BOS recommend Warrant 13.
- 106 Seconded by Selectman Goldman
- Selectman Tombarello stated that Articles 2-12 all have a tax impact but this article does
- not. He said this is the same thing the Town went through last year and feels there will be
- funds spent if this article passes. He said last year's article also said there was no tax
- impact and it cost the Town a lot of money in legal fees alone. He said he will vote no for
- this article and he will be rerunning again for Selectman to keep this from going through.
- Selectwoman Buco stated this provides the residents of Sandown to make a decision once
- and for all as to whether they want to withdraw from the district. She said the money was
- already spent to do the study last year and they have a viable plan to withdraw. Selectman
- Goldman disagrees that there is a viable plan in place and is unhappy that they are back to
- the same place they were a year ago. He said he agrees with Selectman Tombarello and
- will be voting in favor of not recommending this article. Selectman Treanor agreed with
- 118 Selectman Tomabrello and Selectman Goldman. Selectman Tombarello said he spoke with
- Superintendent Metzler today and he told Selectman Tombarello that if this warrant article
- passes Sandown will be the only town responsible for any funding of it. He said the other 3
- towns will not be paying anything for the research as they already have done so last year.
- He also stated that Superintendent Metzler said that he will freeze funds on both schools in
- order to pay for the tax impact on this article. Selectman Buco said this is a cooperative

- school and the coop should absorb the cost and there shouldn't be a threat to keep towns
- within the district from looking into other options. Selectman Tombarello asked Mrs.
- Green if she has her Superintendent Metzler say this. Selectman Goldman said that if Mrs.
- Green is allowed to comment then he hopes the other side would be able to comment as
- well and Selectwoman Buco said the Mrs. Green would be commenting as a School Board
- Member. Selectman Devine said he would allow Mrs. Green to answer the question that
- was asked. Donna Green came forward and said yes she has heard Superintendent Metzler
- threaten to freeze the accounts of Sandown schools to cover the cost of a withdrawal. She
- then proceeded to say that she feels they are dealing with a thug. Selectman Tomabrello
- stated there is no way there is no cost associated with this article. Selectwoman Buco said
- this is a Citizen's Petitioned Article and can't be amended.

CORRESPONDENCE

Lynne said they received a notice of decision from the Sandown ZBA stating there will be a public hearing for the property located at 323 Main St., as they are looking to convert this into a residential dwelling. Lynne said they are being notified because they are abutters to this property. Lynne said it was voted by the ZBA 5-0-0 to grant the request.

Lynne said there is a memo from the assessors stating they have completed the review of the sales data for the town and they are within the limits. Selectman Devine felt the 88% was too low and should be at least 90% and asked Lynne to look into this. Lynne said this could be because it is a median ration and not the overall equalization but she will look into it.

Lynne said they received 3 letters from Comcast. One is an address notification asking that any franchise agreement changes be sent to Manchester and Philadelphia. One is for the Municipal Emergency Reporting Procedures, and the third one is a notification that the Annual Customer Notices have gone out.

Lynne said they received a letter from Trinity. Selectman Goldman said they are partnering with a company to pinpoint real time drug overdoses. He said if they respond to a numerous amounts of drug overdoses in a certain area they will be able to identify which dealer the drugs are coming from.
