## Review of proposed 2018 budget proposals for Executive and Government Buildings **Executive - 4130-01**

- Lynne Blaisdell is presenting this budget 62
- 63 Lynne stated there are a few items that needed to be reviewed. Computer Support,
- Comptuer Software & Hardware and Stone Water Management. She said there was 64
- concern regarding the cost of the IT contract, so she asked for quotes from other companies 65
- as well as she received a different proposal from their current vendor in the amount of 66
- 67 \$22,308.00, which is less than the \$28,184.00 that Lynne brought before the Board last
- week. The Board is in agreement with this amount. 68
- Storm Water Management Paula updated the Board with the information that she 69
- 70 received. Lynne stated the Board signed an agreement last week with RPC to allow them to
- 71 help the town with the process, however it is difficult to put an amount to this at this time.
- Lynne handed the Board a packet as a guide. Paula referred to the RPC newsletter and said 72
- 73 there is a lot of helpful information within. She referred to the second to last page under
- the heading "What Will It Cost?" She said the range is \$40,000.00 \$500,00.00 annually. 74
- She feels that Sandown is on the lower end. She stated there is a technical checklist of 75
- items that need to be completed. She then referred to the "Actions and Notes" column 76
- which lists what support is likely needed. She said \$10.000.00 is not an unrealistic number 77
- to begin with. Selectman Cleveland said that this was talked about and approved by the 78
- Planning Board and there was not a lot of storm water and run off within the Town. He 79
- said he has a Planning Board meeting tomorrow evening and will ask for information from 80
- them as well. Paula stated the town may need to look into elicit septic tanks on the river 81
- 82 that may be leaking into the waters. Selectman Cleveland said it is too early to tell and is
- not happy with our local government mandating this and not providing funding to do so 83

- and Selectman Goldman agrees. Selectman Goldman would like to allow Selectman 84
- Cleveland 1 week to talk to the Planning Board to gather more information before the 85
- Board makes a decision. Lynne noted that the Planning Board usually comes to the BOS 86
- and stated the decision needs to me made sooner rather than later. Paula said they must 87
- comply with what the state is mandating. The Board agrees on the \$10,000.00 amount. 88
- Lynne said the new budget number would be \$282,368.00. 89
- **Motion by** Selectwoman Buco to recommend this budget to the Budget Committee with 90
- Gross Expenses of \$282,368.00, Revenue of \$350.00 and Net Expenses of \$282,018.00. 91

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### **Government Buildings - 4194**

Lynne is presenting this budget. She stated that she met with the Budget Committee last week and reviewed the requested items, she also noted there are a few items that she is still waiting for quotes. Lynne said the Budget Committee was not in favor of paving the parking lot in the amount of \$25,300.00, air conditioning in the amount of \$20,650.00 and a few others. Selectman Cleveland said that he feels the parking lot needs to be paved and the town hall needs the air conditioners. He also stated the second floor air conditioner of the police station is not a priority at this time. Selectwoman Buco asked what the \$25,300.00 includes for the paying and Lynne said it includes the grinding of the existing of the lot and paving of what is there and paving the area that goes out to Hampstead Rd. Selectwoman Buco asked if less can be done to the parking lot so that it will cost less. Selectman Goldman stated that the back area is bad, and the ambulance will be utilizing that area as well and more personal vehicles will be coming and going much more. There was more discussion regarding what area of the parking lot needs to be done. Selectman Goldman said he in favor of the entire list except for the air conditioner at the police station as well the facia boards at the Train Depot. Lynne said that there will be money in the

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- Police budget and most of these items pertaining to that budget should be able to be done. 114
- Selectman Goldman recapped and said he is in favor of the entire list except for the air 115
- conditioner at the Police station and the facia boards at the Depot. 116
- 117 Lynne said the total of this line now is \$66,860.00 and asked the Board if they would like to
- encumber funds from this year's budget for some of the items on the list. She said she 118
- would like to encumber funds for the air conditioning system at the town hall which is 119
- \$10,650.00. 120
- 121 *Motion by* Selectman Cleveland to encumber from the budget \$10,650.00 for the purpose
- of the air conditioner units in upper town hall with Palm Tree Air. 122

- Selectman Goldman asked if the Board supports this or if they should recommend a 270
- petition article. Selectman Cleveland said he likes the idea but there are too many 271
- variables. Selectman Goldman said he thinks it's a great idea but would like to see it be a 272
- petition article as well. He is concerned with the continuity of the group and the financial 273
- support needed for maintenance and insurance and prefers it to be done as a petitioned 274
- article. Selectwoman Buco agrees. 275
- The consensus of the Board is that this be a petitioned warrant article. 276

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- Paula said the Town Clerk received a letter from the lottery and would like to know if they
- would like to have a warrant article regarding this. Paula said currently the only restaurant 279
- is Zorvino's but it is recommended that you should be thinking about it for other potential 280
- restaurants in town. This is to allow Keno at local restaurants. The consensus of the Board 281
