32 33	Hudgins. Motion by Selectman Tombarello to accept these minutes as amended.

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Review of 2019 budget proposals for Executive, Government Buildings, Health Officer, Animal Control and Police

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Health Officer

- Ed Mencis is here presenting this budget. Ed said the water testing will stay the same as last year and he is asking for an increase in the Seminars line. Selectman Cleveland asked if this budget reflects the changes that were made to the inspector's budgets and Lynne said this is a stipend budget and isn't fee based.
- *Motion by* Selectman Tombarello to recommend this budget to the Budget Committee with 59 Gross Expenses of \$4,232.00, Revenue of \$0.00 and Net Expenses of \$4,232.00. 60
- **Seconded by** Selectman Brown 61
- *In favor* Selectman Tombarello, Selectman Goldman, Selectman Cleveland and Selectman 62 63 Brown.
 - Motion passes unanimously

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Police budget

Chief Gordon is presenting this budget. Selectman Brown said he appreciates the back-up information provided. Selectman Brown asked about the Witness Fee line that is budgeted for \$4,876 but hasn't been spent in several years. Chief Gordon said this is in case there is a need for an officer to go to court and they are paid overtime for this. He said he is including 4 full time officers with an average of \$27.81 per hour with only allocating 8 hours per year for each of the officers. This also includes 2 part time officers with an average of \$20.56 per hour with only allocating 8 hours per year for each officer. Chief Gordon said he keeps reducing this line each year as he is not using it but does need to keep money in that line. Selectman Goldman asked about the Unused Sick Time Payout as it is a new line. Chief Gordon said this has been coming from the Payroll line but feels this should be a separate line as this is something that gets paid out at the end of each year.

- Selectman Goldman asked if there was an advantage in going out to bid regarding the 80
- Prosecution line because \$15,000.00 is budgeted each year. Selectman Goldman asks the 81
- 82 Board their opinion and Selectman Tombarello said he feels it is best to have a personal
- 83 prosecutor because the are also available to answer questions any time. Chief Gordon said

- he could see entertaining this if the prosecution was continually increasing their fees, but
- 85 they have been the same rate for the past 6 or 7 years. Selectman Goldman feels that the
- 86 contract should be revisited in order to see what is available. Chief Gordon said if the
- 87 consensus of the Board would like him to look into it he will but he feels like if it isn't
- broken then there is nothing to fix. Selectman Cleveland feels that is would be good if Chief
- 89 Gordon can look into this for next year as he has already prepared the budget and
- 90 Selectman Goldman said he asked for this to be looked into last year as well and Chief
- 91 Gordon said he doesn't remember the conversation.
- 92 Selectman Brown asked about the Part Time Holiday and Part Time Vacation lines and is
- asking why this line hasn't been spent in the past and Chief Gordon said it looks like it is
- coming out of the regular payroll line instead of where it should be.
- 95 Selectman Brown said he'd like to make sure the money is coming out of the correct line.
- 96 Selectman Cleveland asked about the tuition reimbursement line and Chief Gordon said he
- 97 reduced it in years past and then they ended up going over. He said he doesn't anticipate
- 98 anyone using this money next year.
- 99 Selectman Goldman asked about the Equipment Maintenance line and the \$4,000.00
- increase and Chief Gordon said this is for IOC and feels that this line has been under
- 101 budgeted in the past few years.
- Selectman Goldman asked about the Cruiser line and Chief Gordon said he currently has
- \$14,000 in the Detail Revolving Fund to offset the cost of a cruiser. He said they can either
- leave the money in the account and let it build for a few years and purchase a vehicle with
- it or they can use a portion of it to offset the cost that is proposed in the budget.
- 106 Chief Gordon explained \$10,041 is for the SUV lease and the \$9,482.45 is for the 2019
- 107 Charger lease which totals \$19,523.00. Selectman Brown said from 2017 the budget
- increased by \$89,000.00 and Selectman Goldman stated this is mostly due to the payroll
- increase. Selectman Goldman said he understands the needs of the town but is having a
- hard time supporting an 8.4% increase. Chief Gordon said most of the increase is from the
- Payroll and the Cruiser line and offered to take money from the Detail Account and the
- Board didn't want him to use those funds, they'd rather see this account grow. He also
- stated that the numbers in this budget is what it takes to run the department, he did not
- include a wish list within the budget.
- 115 Selectman Tombarello asked about the Uniform line and Chief Gordon said he will be using
- this for Rachel, which is a new officer.
- 117 *Motion by* Selectman Cleveland to recommend this budget to the Budget Committee with
- 118 Gross Expenses \$752,635.00, Revenue of \$3,275.00 and Net Expenses of \$749,360.00.
- 119 **Seconded by Selectman Tombarello**
- Selectman Tombarello asked about the Revenue line and Chief Gordon said this is payment
- for licenses to carry and reports sent out.
- 122 In favor Selectman Tombarello, Selectman Goldman, Selectman Cleveland and Selectman
- 123 Brown.
- 124 *Motion passes unanimously*
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Animal Control budget

- 131 Chief Gordon is presenting this budget. Selectman Tombarello asked about the Payroll line
- not being used and Chief Gordon said this is a part time position and it is hard to budget.
- 133 There is also a new person in this role. Selectman Brown asked if it would be a hardship to
- cut this line to \$5,000.00 or \$6,000.00. Chief Gordon said he based this amount on 8.5 hours
- per week worked, reduced from 13. Chief Gordon said this position is also a member of the
- contract, so the salary went from part time to full time.
- 137 Selectman Goldman said this is a relatively new employee and would be okay with it the
- way it is and would like to see what the job takes next year. Chief Gordon said this is an on-
- call position and he estimates 8.5 hours worked each week and it doesn't matter who is in
- the position, it is based on the hourly rate times the 8.5 hours.
- 141 *Motion by* Selectman Brown to recommend this budget to the Budget Committee with
- Gross Expenses of \$14,600.00, Revenue of \$500.00 and Net Expenses of \$14,100.00.
- 143 **Seconded by Selectman Tombarello**
- 144 In favor Selectman Tombarello, Selectman Goldman, Selectman Cleveland and Selectman
- 145 Brown.
- 146 *Motion passes unanimously*

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Government Buildings

- Lynne said this is a first look at this budget to plug figures into the columns. She said she's
- having a hard time getting quotes for some various projects but will continue to work on
- 152 them.
- Payroll line is the hourly rate plus the 3% increase, which is \$24,824.00. The Electric line
- will be increased to \$17,000.00. For the Oil line Lynne explained the rate increased slightly
- and recommended increasing this line to \$9,000.00, Selectman Goldman suggested
- \$9,500.00 and the Board agreed. Gas/Propane line Lynne feels this line is ok as is. Bldg
- Maintenance line Lynne said this will have to wait for further discussion. Lynne is asking
- the Board if they are in favor of her looking into paving the front walkway and the Board is
- in agreement with this. Alarm System line Lynne said the Police Chief is in need of a new
- alarm system and Lynne would like to look into another system/vendor for the town and
- the Board agreed. Selectman Goldman suggested moving all the alarms in town to this
- budget. Lynne is comfortable with this line at \$2,400.00 and the Board is in agreement
- with this. Lynne said she is comfortable with leaving the Supply line at \$3,500.00. On the Equipment Maintenance line Lynne said she will bring this back to the Board but feels like
- it will stay close to the \$5,300.00. Uniform Allowance line there was a discussion and the
- Board feels the custodian should be wearing professional shirts. Lynne will reach out to
- 167 Rockingham Team Wear to see what they can provide.
- Lynne let the Board know she is struggling with getting quotes on painting or siding the
- town hall and carpentry on the posts at the front of town hall. She asked the Board if they
- would like her to look at the handicapped ramp as well and they said yes.

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NEW BUSINESS

- 177 Final 2018 Tax Rate and signing of tax warrant
- Lynne said the final rate is \$26.54 per thousand and they are in line with the acceptable
- 179 levels needed to collect.
- 180 *Motion by* Selectman Tombarello to set the 2018 tax rate for the Town of Sandown in the
- amount of \$26.54 per thousand.
- 182 **Seconded by** Selectman Cleveland.
- Selectman Goldman stated the 2018 tax rate is \$26.54 per thousand, with \$4.26 town, \$1.00
- county, \$19.16 local education and \$2.12 for state education.
- 185 *In Favor*, Selectman Cleveland, Selectman Tombarello, Selectman Brown and Selectman
- 186 Goldman.

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Review and discussion about proposed warrant articles for 2019

Lynne presented the Board with a list of the articles the Board has briefly discussed with

them being the Block Grant, Fire apparatus, OHD article, Isiah 58 NH, the BOS stipend,

changing the second session, the operating budget, RIP and the Capital Reserve Fund, the

Revaluation and an article for Phillips pond maintenance. Lynne said she is expecting some

articles from the Highway Dept. for equipment, and a warrant article from the trustees to

expand the cemetery. Lynne said they still need to talk about a Storm Water Management

article and possibly another warrant article regarding the dog park. The Board also still

needs to discuss the possibility of accepting partial payments for taxes. Dawn Nicolaisen

said they are encouraged to be a prepayment town to increase the cashflow in the town.

She was told it was up to the Board to make this decision. Lynne said the assessors are

asking if the Board would consider a warrant article for a solar exemption and she will

200 have more information on this at a future meeting. She talked about an article for the

renovations for town office space and for the back-parking lot as well. There was a brief

discussion regarding a Capital Reserve Fund for capital improvements and Lynne said the

voters will be able to vote on the expenditures as well. Lynne said there may be a warrant article from the Heritage Commission as well.

Selectman Goldman - Heritage Commission met on Thursday and elected their officers and 221 are excited to move forward. Next meeting is end of November or beginning of December. 222 He said the Board will need to revisit his term. 223 Selectman Brown – said he is no longer the liaison to the SSATP, so he is left with the 224 Library and Highway and if anyone has anything they would like him to take on he would 225 be willing to do so.
