5	Meeting Date: Wednesday, December 11, 2013

10	Members Present: Bruce Cleveland, Steve Brown and Terry Treanor (Selectman Ex-
11	officio), Dawn Nicolaisen.

15	The meeting was called to order by Bruce Cleveland at 6:30.
16	
17	Bruce Cleveland asked Terry Treanor if there is any interest in the open Budget
18	Committee position and Terry said no.
19	
20	Bruce said the date for the Annual Public Hearing is scheduled for January 16 th .
21	
22	Bruce asked the Committee to review the minutes of Wednesday, December 4, 2013.
23	Bruce said the minutes of December 4 th are accepted as written.
24	
25	Motion by Bruce Cleveland to put the Moderator account budget 4140.3 on the table
26	for discussion.
27	Seconded by Steve Brown.
28	Lynne Blaisdell is presenting this budget.
29	Lynne explained that there is a slight increase in the Seminar line as the new moderator
30	would like to attend two seminars. Lynne explained that the Ballot Counters line is

- 31 \$2,250.00 as there are 5 clerks and 3 elections in 2014 at \$150.00 per election per person.
- 32 For the Ballots & Coding line, Lynne estimated that at \$6,000.00. She said this depends
- 33 on how much information is on the ballot. She said that she looked at 2010's budget,
- 34 which also had 3 elections and \$4,700.00 was paid for ballots and coding for the Town
- election, she said \$1,100.00 and \$705.00 was paid for the two State elections for coding.
- 36 Lynne said she is comfortable with \$375.00 for the Meals line. She also said for the
- 37 Voting Equipment there is a bit of an increase as they need to order new voting booths.
- 38 Lynne said she can get voting booths for \$650.00 for one booth divided into 4 stations,
- 39 which will bring us closer to the State compliance. Cathy Gorman asked about the
- 40 Ballots/Coding line and feels that \$6,000.00 may be a bit high. Lynne said that she
- 41 would be comfortable with \$5,250.00 for that line.
- 42 *Motion by* Bruce to reduce the Ballots/Coding line from \$6,000.00 to \$5,250.00.
- 43 *Seconded by* Dawn Nicolaisen.
- 44 In Favor Dawn Nicolaisen, Steve Brown, Bruce Cleveland, Terry Treanor and Cathy
- 45 *Gorman*.
- 46 *Motion passes unanimously.*
- 47 *Motion by* Dawn Nicolaisen to accept the Election & Registration account budget
- 48 (Moderator) with Gross Expenses of \$10,000.00, Revenue of \$0.00 and Net Expenses of
- 49 \$10,000.00 pending further review.
- 50 Seconded by Steve Brown.
- 51 In Favor Dawn Nicolaisen, Steve Brown, Bruce Cleveland, Terry Treanor and Cathy
- 52 Gorman.
- 53 Motion passes unanimously.
- 54
- 55 Motion by Bruce Cleveland to put the Community Assistance Account budget 4445.0 on
- 56 the table for discussion.
- 57 Seconded by Steve Brown.
- 58 Lynne Blaisdell is presenting this budget. Lynne said this is the welfare budget for the
- 59 Town that helps the residents with financial assistance. Lynne provided the Budget
- 60 Committee with a list of financial assistance that has been provided so far this year.
- 61 Lynne also said there is a slight reduction in this budget as well. Dawn Nicolaisen asked

- 62 about the Rent line with only \$4,700.00 being expended this year and wanted to know if
- 63 that line can be reduced. Lynne said in 2012 \$14,000.00 was expended and you never
- 64 know how much you are going to need. Lynne did say it is required by law that the
- 65 Town provide residents that qualify for help and if the budget is fully expended the Town
- 66 is still responsible to find the money somewhere in the budget. Cathy Gorman asked if
- 67 Lynne sees a trend going down at all and Lynne said yes, she does see a slight trend but
- doesn't feel the economy is going to affect us positively yet.
- 69 *Motion by* Steve Brown to accept the Community Assistance budget with Gross
- Expenses of \$13,101.00, Revenue of \$500.00 and Net Expenses of \$12,601.00 pending
- 71 further review.
- 72 Seconded by Dawn Nicolaisen.
- In Favor Dawn Nicolaisen, Steve Brown, Bruce Cleveland, Terry Treanor and Cathy
 Gorman.
- 75 Motion passes unanimously.
- 76
- 77 Motion by Bruce Cleveland to put the Health & Human Services account budget

78 *4415.0 on the table for discussion.*

79 Seconded by Steve Brown.

- 80 Cheryl Eastman, Finance Director is presenting this budget.
- 81 Dawn Nicolaisen asked if there is a reason why the requested amount from the American
- 82 Red Cross went up so substantially and Cheryl said no, the only information she has is
- 83 what was in the packet which doesn't explain the increased amount. Steve Brown asked
- 84 why the Finance Director is presenting this budget and feels like the Committee is
- 85 wasting her time. Keith Bates from Rockingham County Community Action thanks the
- 86 Budget Committee for their continued support to their organization. Keith explains that
- 87 Rockingham County Community Action helps the Towns/Cities with their Town
- 88 assistance program. Dawn Nicolaisen asked Steve Brown if the Budget Committee has
- 89 ever not paid the requested amount and Steve said yes on occasion. He referred to the
- 90 Sad Cafe' (because they're payroll was upwards of \$100,000.00) that the Budget
- 91 Committee removed from the budget and put it to warrant article, which ultimately failed

- 92 during the election. He said if the Budget Committee felt there was duplicate effort
- 93 between two organizations they reduce the amount requested.
- 94 *Motion by* Cathy Gorman to reduce the American Red Cross amount from \$4,200.00 to
- 95 **\$1,900.00**.
- 96 Seconded by Terry Treanor.
- 97 In Favor Dawn Nicolaisen, Steve Brown, Bruce Cleveland, Terry Treanor and Cathy
- 98 Gorman.
- 99 Motion passes unanimously.
- 100 Dawn Nicolaisen asked if the Family Promise organization has helped any Sandown
- 101 families, as the letter in the packet states that there were 3 Sandown families that applied
- 102 but several families are turned away due to the popularity of the program.
- 103 Dawn said she isn't going to make a motion to reduce this but next year she would like
- 104 information as to what families are being helped. Steve Brown said he would like to
- 105 know how the Budget Committee feels about the Family Promise organization so he is
- 106 going to make a motion.
- 107 *Motion by* Steve Brown to reduce the Family Promise line to \$0.00.
- 108 Seconded by Cathy Gorman.
- 109 *In Favor*, Steve Brown, Terry Treanor and Cathy Gorman.
- 110 *Opposed* Dawn Nicolaisen.
- 111 *Abstain* Bruce Cleveland as he helps with this organization.
- 112 *Motion passes 3-1-1*
- 113 Motion by Steve Brown to accept the Health & Human Services Account budget with
- 114 Gross Expenses of \$20,487.00, Revenue of \$0.00 and Net Expenses of 20,487.00 pending
- 115 further review.
- 116 Seconded by Cathy Gorman.
- 117 In Favor, Steve Brown, Terry Treanor, Cathy Gorman and Dawn Nicolaisen
- 118 *Abstain* Bruce Cleveland as he helps with this organization.
- 119 Motion passes 4-0-1
- 120
- 121 Motion by Bruce Cleveland to put the Benefits Account Budget 4155.0 on the table for
- 122 discussion.

123 Seconded by Steve Brown.

- 124 Cheryl Eastman, the Finance Director is presenting this budget.
- 125 Steve Brown asked if any of the lines can be changed or is everything contractual.
- 126 Cheryl said the BOS have the option to offer Health Insurance but the rest of them have
- 127 to do with the taxes and the amount that is paid to the employees affects the other lines.
- 128 Bruce Cleveland asked why there is such a big increase in the budget and Cheryl said
- 129 with the 2% raise affects the retirement, the Fica and the NH Retirement system is
- 130 required by law. Cheryl also said the amount the Town has to pay for the police is 25.3%
- 131 for the second half of the year. Dawn Nicolaisen said the Health Insurance line is only at
- 132 74% and wanted to know why and Cheryl said they have to allow for an employee to take
- 133 the insurance during the year so there is a little bit of a buffer in that line. Cathy Gorman
- asked what the big increase is in the Health Reimbursement line and Cheryl explained
- that the amount each employee receives was increased by \$500.00 because next year they
- 136 will have a higher deductible. Cheryl said the premium difference from last year to this
- 137 year for a single plan was about \$425.00 per month and next year will be \$418.00, which
- 138 was a \$14,000.00 savings to the Town.
- 139 *Motion by* Cathy Gorman to reduce the Health Reimbursement line from \$2,000.00 per
- 140 person back to \$1,500.00.
- 141 *Seconded by* Bruce Cleveland for discussion.
- 142 Cathy Gorman feels that the reality is that all health insurances and deductibles are going
- 143 up and it is not fair for the taxpayers of the Town to supplement the Reimbursement
- 144 Account for the Town Employees and the premium portion they pay is only 10%.
- 145 *In Favor*, Cathy Gorman, Dawn Nicolaisen and Bruce Cleveland.
- 146 *Opposed* Steve Brown and Terry Treanor.
- 147 *Motion passes 3-2-0*
- 148 *Motion by* Cathy Gorman to reduce the Health Reimbursement Account line from
- 149 \$181,667.00 to \$175,167.00.
- 150 *Seconded by* Bruce Cleveland.
- 151 In Favor, Cathy Gorman, Dawn Nicolaisen and Bruce Cleveland.
- 152 *Opposed* Steve Brown and Terry Treanor.
- 153 Motion passes 3-2-0

- 154 *Motion by* Cathy Gorman to accept the Benefits account with \$409,603.00, Revenue of
- 155 \$0.00 and Net Expenses of \$409,603.00 pending further review.
- 156 *Seconded by* Bruce Cleveland.
- 157 *In Favor*, Cathy Gorman, Dawn Nicolaisen, Bruce Cleveland and Terry Treanor.
- 158 *Opposed* Steve Brown
- 159 *Motion passes 4-1-0*
- 160
- 161 Bruce Cleveland said the Final Public Hearing is scheduled for January 16, 2014, when
- 162 every budget will be reviewed.
- 163
- 164 Dawn Nicolaisen stated that she hopes that department heads take the upcoming break to
- 165 review their budgets and possibly sharpen their pencils and come to the Final Public
- 166 Hearing with responsible budgets.
- 167
- 168 Cathy Gorman encourages all Sandown residents to attend the School Board Deliberative
- 169 Session and Bruce Cleveland encourages everyone to attend the Town Deliberative
- 170 Session as well.
