41	Ms. Cairns noted Mr. Traeger was interested in constructing a trail in the Wells Village Town
42	Forest. He suggested that everyone try and walk it to give him feedback. He was hoping to
43	put together a work crew to begin construction.
44 4 =	Ma Winmill noted the water energing is shallowing Mr. Condonnel it will be seen in
45 46	Ms. Winmill noted the water crossing is challenging. Mr. Sands agreed it will be especially difficult during high water season and any boulders they placed would be covered. Mr. Butler
40 47	difficult during high water season and any boulders they placed would be covered. Mr. Butler noted they wouldn't be able to get a tractor in there to move the boulders. His concern about
48	building a bridge was it getting washed out during a large storm and any bridge that could

withstand the water that area receives would be close to \$25,000 to construct. They could potentially apply for grants to pay for that.

Ms. Gaudreau noted that there were several areas that would be great wildlife openings. Mr.
 Butler noted that Charlie Moreno could help identify them when he did the forestry
 management plan.

Mr. Carey asked for an update on the status of Mr. Moreno's work. Mr. Butler noted he could follow up. He suggested they could potentially turn the skidder trails the forester creates, when doing the cut, into hiking trails. Mr. Moreno could help them identify the trails.

The board felt it might be best to wait and talk with Mr. Moreno before moving forward with any trails.

Ms. Winmill noted the parking area needed additional work. Ms. Cairns noted that Mr.
Traeger spoke with Mr. McCarthy at the Planning Board meeting. The two are set to have a
site visit so Mr. Traeger can explain what further work they would like to see. Ms. Winmill
requested in the future, the entire board be notified when meetings like that happened so they
could all be informed.

Reed Road Trail

Ms. Cairns noted that Mr. Traeger also wants to construct a handicapped and stroller accessible trail on the town-owned property on Reed Road. It is a fairly flat parcel. The surface would need to be hard-packed but porous.

Ms. Winmill noted that Mr. Traeger looked into grants and contacted RPC to see if there were other funding options available to them.

Mr. Gilday added they would need to submit a permit by notification to NHDES for the trail.

Minimalist Campout

Ms. Cairns noted that Mr. Major would like to do a minimalist campout in one of the town forests with the boy scouts on December 9-11. They would need to cut boughs to create shelters and wanted permission to do so and see if anyone had any concerns.

Mr. Butler noted concern about opening up wildlife shelters by cutting a lot of boughs from the trees, but will trust in the scout leadership to follow best management practices for the forest and wildlife.

No one else on the board had a concern.

New Business

- 91 Mr. Carey purchased the winter rye for the community garden.
- **MOTION:** Mr. Sands made a motion to reimburse Mr. Carey \$25 out of the Conservation checking account. Mr. Butler seconded the motion. Members voted in favor. Mr. Carey abstained.

Old Business

Ms. Winmill and Ms. Gaudreau attended the Trail Finder workshop. It gives them the ability to have our trails mapped on the site, but they need the GIS data of our trails to incorporate them. The town has the option to highlight whatever they want on each trail (e.g.; stone structures, water bodies, plant species). They can give them access to be administrators so they can set up alerts, add or subtract details, or pull trails off the site if they generate too

much traffic. It is a very useful, easy to use program. Ms. Gaudreau has all the trails mapped on Map My Hike. She will send the information to them. Ms. Winmill and Ms. Gaudreau

would be happy to be the administrators.
