39	Village Town Forest. The purchase is from Ms. Judith Ross. Ms. Ross has

41	of land that the SCC is still interested in and the SCC will be working with

- Ms. Ross to clear the lot and straighten out the land dispute. Both Mr. Butler
- and Mr. Gilday have walked and inspected the property. From Mr. Butler
- and Mr. Gilday's walk and inspection the have found a nice wetland area for
- turtle breeding. Mr. Butler also made mention that there is a fair amount of
- upland that was probably logged 20 years ago, and the vegetation is growing
- back nicely. Mr. Gilday mentioned that the property is clean a few shot gun
- shells here and there but not much trash.
- The purchase of this property will bring the Wells Village Town Forest
- from 116 acres to 192 acres of conservation land. The closing on the
- property is scheduled for Monday April 30th at 4p.m.
