Patty brought up the fact that maybe this year we should eliminate the free balloons and committee members agreed.

The gentleman that was at last year's event doing balloon animals for the children cannot attend the event this year. A quote was received from Gigmasters for a balloon twister at a price of $\$ 500$ for 4 hours. The committee agreed that was too costly. Members will reach out to see if we can find any other balloon twisters.

Bob Brouder may know someone from the electric providers that could do a demonstration for the public.

## Parade

Windham Community Band will not be able to participate in the even this year, so the committee is seeking a band for the parade.

Applications will be finalized for the parade entry and children's bike parade along with the invitations to dignitaries including the Board of Selectmen.

The bagpiper has agreed to participate this year.

A suggestion was made to hold a children's talent show.
Paula is still negotiating with Seacoast Science Center regarding the price to bring tidal creatures to the event.

A BMX bicycle show should be researched.
Paula received an email from the Hampstead Knights of Columbus saying they have a jail and bail set up that they are no longer using and will sell for approximately $\$ 400$. The Historical Society will discuss that possibility at their next meeting.
