I. Reports

A. Minutes: approved, no changes

B. Student Report (Claire Chambers, Student Government Vice- President):

- i. The annual Fall Feast was held last Thursday, November 4<sup>th</sup> at 5:00pm in the Café Commons. Sponsored by Student Government, this event provides a free Thanksgiving dinner and a night of entertainment to honor those who have served or who are currently serving America in the armed forces. Over 150 veterans attended, which was an outstanding turnout and the largest ever in the history of the Fall Feast. Scott Smilinich, a Stonington High School teacher, was this year's guest speaker. Special thanks went out to all of the individuals who made the event such a success. National Honor Society hosted a fundraiser for the Breast Cancer Research Foundation the week of October 25th. Students were encouraged to "think pink" by wearing pink clothing. In home bases, students could buy pink ribbons for \$1, with all proceeds going towards the cause. The home base with the most ribbons at the end of the week won a donut breakfast. In the end, through positive support and generous contributions, NHS earned over \$1,600 to donate to the Breast Cancer Research Foundation. Next, the SHS Band marched in the Pawcatuck Veteran's Day Parade held on Saturday, November 6<sup>th</sup>. This talented band can be heard at the Turkey Day football game, scheduled for Thursday, November 25<sup>th</sup> at Westerly High School. The performance of The Miracle Worker, Stonington High School's Broad Street Bears' fall production, is just around the corner. Show dates are Friday, November 19<sup>th</sup> and Saturday, November 20<sup>th</sup> at 7pm, and Sunday, November 21<sup>st</sup> at 2pm in the Stonington High School auditorium. This year's inspiring production involves over 45 students on and off stage and is directed by Erin-Sousa Stanley. boys soccer, field hockey, and girls and boys cross country. In Cross Country, Liz Hutchins was named All-ECCs and placed 12<sup>th</sup> in the division championship and 15<sup>th</sup> in the state meet. The girls' soccer team was champions in the medium division for ECCs. Currently, they are in the playoffs for the state tournament. The field hockey team was also victorious in winning yet another ECC small division champion's title, their 19<sup>th</sup> in the past 20 years. Congratulations to all and a heartfelt note of thanks for all of the coaches, too.

i. 2010-2011 Goals:

- Community Partnerships: Superintendent's breakfast forum with community members held at SHS focused on brainstorming possible community-school collaborations.
