- Reports
 - Minutes (11/15/11): approved
 - Student Report: Jacqueline Albert presented an overview of recent Student Government and school activities. Of note, a successful Reindeer Games was held and enjoyed by the student body. They collected \$205.10 from the "pie in the face" contest to donate to Case for Dignity. Winter sports teams are underway and doing very well. January 27 they will host an American Red Cross Blood Drive. All SHS students over 17 can participate. Students are in the midst of exams completing the first semester and ready to start the second. Student Government will be hosting a comfort station selling hot chocolate to students in between exam sessions.

 - Administrators' report (Mr. Mark Friese):
 - NEW Parent Information Night for grades 9-11.
 - New this year is a presentation to parents of students in grade 9-11 to highlight course's available. The purpose of this is to ensure parents understand the various academic pathways embedded in the curriculum. The outcome of this meeting is that parents will better understand what courses are required for various career pathways and what electives will also benefit the students career goals.
