B. Student Report: E. Collette.

Induction will be held this Thursday. The SHS Jazz Band recently performed at the Waterford Jazz Festival, where they won Best Overall Saxophone Section. This is the first time in 5 years that SHS has placed at the festival. The Band will perform in the Mystic Memorial Day Parade. The band and chorus is hard at work preparing for the SHS Pops concert on June 5. This year's theme is Space. The AP Literature Classes at Stonington High School put together their annual Kaleidoscope evening where there were both wonderful poetry readings and musical performances. The Junior Class will be holding their annual Bear-a-Thon on Memorial Day. Part of their proceeds will be donated to the Mystic VFW in honor of Memorial Day. Also, Congratulations to the Crew team who won 2nd place in States last week!

- C. Junior Project: J. McCurdy states that the juniors from Student Government are going to PMS and MMS to show their video and break into small groups for discussion with student regarding involvement at the high school level. St. Michael's will be offered this same opportunity. This will be done before the Activities Fair, June 1. This will become an annual duty of the Student Government.
- D. FACT Update: Faculty Adminstration Collaborative Team has recently met to revise the school's policy on electronic devices. Devices should not be visible during the school day. If a student violates the rule more than 5 times the device is taken from them. The team also revised the attendance policy. There have been a lot of tardies in all grades. New policy will be over 4 tardies-office detention, over 6 tardies-in school suspension with a letter going home to the parents. No problem with senior release students. Students are pulled out of class too much lately so X-Block will be revised for next year with the tradional XBlock on even days and an ZBlock on odd days. Students will report to homebase for ½ of the time then have lunch. Advisories, academic interventions, NHS, rehearsals, club meetings and any assemblies of classes will take place during this time.
