- Work Experience
- Special Education configuration determining the best options for "the least restrictive environment"
- Academies formalizing and marketing career paths
- Magnet Programs

- Summer Enrichment programs consideration for offerings at Stonington's high school and middle school levels as well as for surrounding area students
- Middle School Enrichment potential coordination with town agencies regarding activities for middle school students
- Academic Field Trips Principals have been asked to include funds for four local field trips for students in grades K - 8 in their 2014-15 budgets. Potential budget impact.
- Local History Curriculum partnering with local historic societies

- Is there opportunity to collaborate with other smaller area districts who do not have such programs?
