Minutes from 11/1/10 unanimously approved-motion by Lee Heron, seconded by Conray Wharff and all approved.

Lake Boon Groundwater Protection Team came to offer ideas for possible agreement on changes to the Notice of Intent. LBGWP was represented by Don Hawkes, Lori Hawkes and Richard Bleau.

The LBGWT discussion points were:

- 1. Don't mandate that any HomeOwner fix their well if affected by drawdown.
- 2. Never re-start a draw down if a well is affected.
- 3. File an environmental notification form.
- 4. Make an action plan for stumps that may dislodge during drawdown.
- 5. Get the Fire Departments permission for draw down.
- 6. Use the Lake Boon Association's funding to assist Home Owners whose well is affected by draw down.
- 7. Agree to mediation

The meeting adjourned at 8:13PM

The Lake Boon Commission went into Executive Session from 8:13PM-8:22PM to discuss the LBGWT discussion points. All Commissioners agreed that no new information was presented and to continue with the NOI process.

Gentlemen.

I conducted a survey of Lake Boon on Friday, May 20. During the survey I did confirm the evidence of both Variable milfoil and Curly leaf Pondweed growing at light to moderate levels around the shoreline of the lake.

Isolated growth of individual Fanwort plants were observed in both Basin 3 and 4. They were very small and isolated. The growth pattern of this species seems to be slow to start this season as seen in other water-bodies in the area. We will continue to monitor these areas of growth throughout the season.

Water starwort was seen quite frequently around the shoreline. Although not a subject species within the current contract, if this species is present within the path of the intended target species, it will be controlled with the diquat that is being used for the treatment.

We have the Lake scheduled for treatment on June 6. This treatment will coincide with areas noted on the attached map within Basins 2,3 & 4 and Monahan's Cove Kathy is is the process of making the required notifications for this treatment date.
