Secretary's Report: The minutes from the 1-28-2016 meeting were accepted unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: The Board reviewed the Statement of Sources & Uses of Funds, CY'15 that was submitted for placement in the Annual Report. There was some concern regarding the information shown and how it might not be understood by those viewing it. Transparency is a primary goal for the Board.

Following a lengthy discussion, it was decided that Bob and Rick would rework the first draft. Bob would send it to Board members to gather input (no group discussions...only single responses to Bob) and the Board will review at the next regularly scheduled meeting and vote on the new version.

### Director's Report: Melissa:

- Said that the Randall Building Committee had a walk through the evening before and that she was eager to share the RFQ responses with them.
- Reviewed the statistics and spoke of the possible change from the database Morningstar to Hoopla.
- Noted that Bill Wrigley wanted \$1,000.00 removed from the utilities portion of the library budget as the cost of fuel continues to decrease. The Board noted that it was a change in their approved budget.
- Shared that a FinCom Reserve Fund Transfer Request to the Randall Library's Repairs Maintenance Building budget line item (#62420) for \$4,795.13 to cover all the invoices for the unexpected HVAC repairs from 7/17/2015-10/22/2015 was only approved for \$3,895.13. She is concerned that landscaping would need to be deleted from current plans due to the \$900.00 difference.

## Notes:

A Garaventa mechanic and a State inspector came in to look at/inspect the lift on Jan. 21<sup>st</sup>. We passed inspection for 2016 but the piston shaft is leaking and broken and requires cleaning and refilling yearly/twice yearly. The cleaning and refilling of oil for the pistons is part of our service agreement but we will need to look into the serviceability of the current lift situation. I have requested the cost for replacing the piston packing, and replacement of damaged pipes as well as the cost of a new lift for a comparison. The question is...would it be worth it to replace the lift at the present time, or pay for the cost of yearly/twice piston packing replacements over a 5-7 year span?

Meeting with Bill Wrigley on 1/29/2016 went well- Everything suggested in the tentative FY2017 budget was approved. However-Bill is looking to take an additional \$1,000 out of the Heating and Electric line items-This would be on top of the \$3,000 that I already suggested to take out of the Electric line. I am awaiting his tentative reworking of the library's FY2017 budget. He said that he is taking money from every departments budgets for utilities since the cost of electric and gas is going down. NOTE: We proactively took out money in advance of the meeting which he had originally not noticed- but it was appreciated once it was pointed out. Details at the BoT meeting if requested .
