Call to Order

- Don Rising is Stows' representative to the ARRT (Assabet River Rail Trail).
- Barbara Myles made a motion to have Steve Dungan be an associate member to the Multi-Use Track Road Committee for 6 months, Rachel Ganimian seconded the motion, all were in favor.

Review AECOM Contract:

 After reading and reviewing the AECOM contract this committee does not have any issues with it and will suggest to Bill Wrigley to sign the design contract. All were in favor.

Sub-Reports from Members:

<u>Barbara Myles</u> - Funding report: major funding can possibly come from three sources: the Boston MPO, the

Metropolitan Area Planning Council and Stow's Community Preservation Committee (\$43,000 came from here

which was voted on at town meeting.)

<u>Rachel Ganimian</u> - Real Estate Values report: Studies have shown that homes near rail trails have favorable

sales statistics. Studies also show that homes near rail trails sell for a higher proportion of their asking price

and in about half the time of other homes to be sold in their towns.

<u>John Akers</u> - Surface Materials Report: Massachusetts Department of Transportation has approved recycled,

permeable asphalt, regular asphalt, concrete and chip seal as surfaces for rail trails. Concrete is best, but

asphalt is most common. Using asphalt near the Assabet River would not cause any run-off. Run-off is caused

by the vehicles traveling on the asphalt. Permeable surfaces have to cleaned (pressure washed or vacuumed)

one to two times each year.
